Mr. Editor.—Thinking that perhaps you would be pleased to have a few lines from this place to lay before your general readers, I will try and accomodate you with a letter, though we are located outside the townships of your county, and though I am not at all posted about the transfer of property, accidents, fires, and practical suggestions on good farming, the state of the crops, improvements, nor hundreds of other subjects of interest, and I write only because of the editorial promise of the Enterprise—and the Enterprise never deceives—that your editorial eye will discover, your editorial intellect correct, and your editorial stomach digest and properly prepare the “crude effort” made, and make it presentable to lay before the general reader. But to proceed; and first let me lay down as my first, and it may be at first thought rather a startling proposition, that the good people think that Grass Lake is, geographically considered, the center of the earth. Only think of that Mr. Editor, and not a single earthquake or murder in the place this year. Wonderful place, is it not?

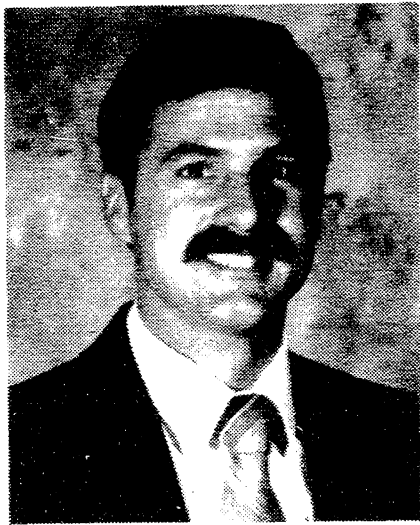
The moral and religious character of the people is known to every man, woman and child in this place, and it is not an unrequited thing to hear them extolling the good qualities and character of their citizens—to strangers, you know—and well do they deserve that praise; nor is the morality of the people wholly unknown abroad.

Grass Lake supports three churches—the Methodist, a large, beautiful and costly structure,

built of brick, and which alone, without any need of praise, attests the spirit, enterprise and wealth of that society; the Congregational church is also a very neat and pleasant building but much smaller than the others; and also the Baptist church, a very substantial and beautiful brick edifice; and within its walls is now in progress a very interesting revival of religion, who the best posted say is resulting in much good.

Among the public buildings there is also a very fine, beautiful and tastefully arranged Union School under splendid management and with a high standard of attainments. But perhaps, Mr. Editor, your readers, or most of them are too familiar with the place to need a description of it. Yet sir, I would like to remark the fact that in Grass Lake there is but one saloon publicly kept, and but one billiard table, a striking comment on some smaller villages in the

United Way Chairpersons Honored

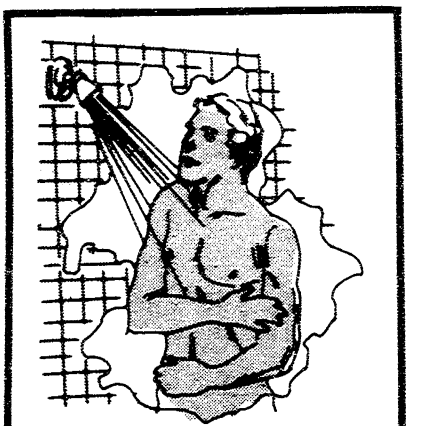

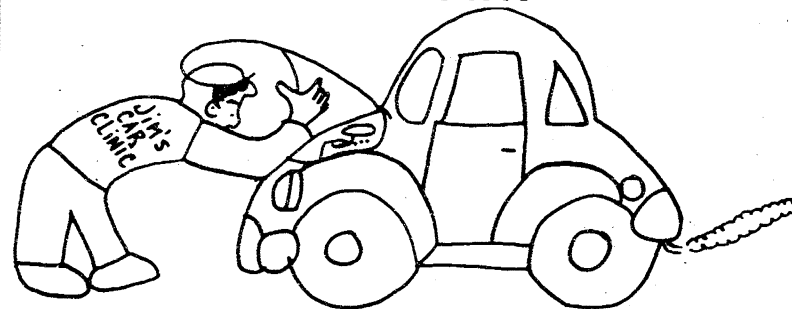

Manchester Wrestling Team

The Manchester Wrestling Team began it's schedule last Thursday, at home against the powerful Stockbridge Panthers. The team found themselves on the short end of a 58-12 score. Nineteen matches were wrestled with fine showings by many first year wrestlers. Pins were recorded by Juniors B.J. Lee, 105 pounds and Joey Deacons at 119 pounds. Bud Ball, a Freshman, scored a 7-6 decision at 112 pounds.

On Saturday, Manchester traveled to the Concord Invitational. This was a strong tournament with last years top two Class D state teams competing. The team wrestled well, taking home a second and two third place medals. B.J. Lee wrestled at 105 pounds and showed why he is one of the best wrestlers in the area. He notched up two pins and earned a silver medal for his efforts. Joey Deacons wrestled his best tournament ever at 119 pounds. He recorded three pins and a decision. Joey's only loss came at the hands of two time State Champion Tom Richardson of Springport. This had him bringing home a bronze medal. The third medalist was senior Co-Captain Steve Vlcek. Through stiff competition Steve recorded two decisions and a pin. Other match winners for the Dutch included; Rick Shear 112, John Lochey 155, Tom Heath 185, and Matt Mazurek at Heavy Weight.

Thursday, December 13, will be the next dual meet for the Dutch Wrestling Squad. Ann Arbor Gabriel Richard will be in town to challenge the Maroon and Gold. Meet time will be 7:00 p.m. On Saturday, December 15, the team will travel to the always tough Dexter Invitational. 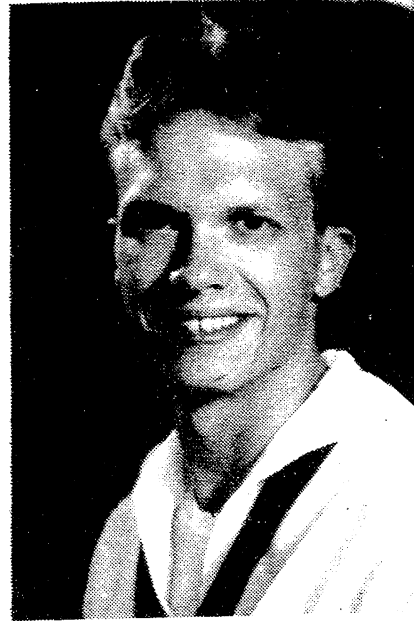

Local Youths Charged

On Thursday, December 6, 1984, the Washtenaw County Sheriff's Department obtained warrant authorizations from the Prosecutor's Office, charging three persons who were involved with providing alcohol to youngsters who attended a large keg party which was held in a Sharon Township gravel pit on September 8, 1984. Charges of contributing to the delinquency of minors and furnishing alcohol to minors were brought against three local 18 year olds, two from Freedom Township and one from Sharon Township.

Four young men from Saline had left this party in the early morning hours of September 9, 1984, and shortly thereafter, were involved in a double traffic fatality on Pleasant Lake Road near Lindemann Road in Freedom Township. It is estimated that 40-50 youngsters from Western Washtenaw County were in attendance, which included persons as young as fourteen years of age.

This culminates a three month investigation undertaken by Deputies of the Traffic Services Section, who learned of the party during the course of the fatality investigation.

Dairy delights for holiday time

LUCIA BRAID

- 5 to 5½ cups all-purpose flour
- 2 packages active dry yeast
- ½ cup sugar
- 1½ teaspoons salt
- 1½ cups milk
- ½ cup (1 stick) butter
- Pinch of saffron*
- 2 eggs
- ¼ teaspoon almond extract
- ½ cup chopped blanched almonds
- 4 teaspoons grated lemon peel
- Whole blanched almonds
- 1 egg
- 1 tablespoon water
- Sugar cubes, crushed

Combine 2 cups flour, yeast, sugar and salt in a large mixing bowl. Combine milk, butter and saffron in a 1-quart saucepan; heat until warm (120-130°F). Add gradually to flour. Beat 2 minutes at medium speed, scraping bowl occasionally. Add 1 cup flour, eggs and almond extract; beat 2 minutes at high speed scraping bowl occasionally. Stir in chopped almonds and lemon peel. Stir in enough remaining flour to make a soft dough. Turn onto lightly floured surface. Knead 8-10 minutes or until smooth and satiny. Place in buttered bowl, turning once to butter top. Cover bowl.

Let rise on a rack over hot water until doubled (1 to 1½ hours). Punch down; let rest 10 minutes. Divide dough into 3 parts. Use 2 parts for base of 2 breads. Set aside remaining dough to be used for braids. Roll each base portion into 7" circle. Place on buttered baking sheet. Divide remaining dough into 6 parts for braids. With hands, roll each into 20" strand. Braid 3 strands together. Place a braid on each dough base, forming circle. Secure ends by pinching dough together. Insert whole almonds into braid. Cover and let rise over warm water until doubled (45-60 minutes). Beat egg and water; brush on dough. Sprinkle with crushed sugar. Bake in preheated 350° oven, 25-30 minutes. Remove to wire rack to cool. To serve: Place four 3-inch red candles in candle holders and insert in braid. Light candles just before serving. Yield: 2 loaves.

*Yellow food color may be substituted for saffron.

CHICKEN QUICHE ALMONDINE

- 1 unbaked pie shell, 9"
- ½ cup (3 oz.) diced chicken
- 3 tablespoons sliced almonds
- 1½ cups (6 oz.) shredded Swiss cheese
- 3 eggs
- 1½ cups milk
- ½ teaspoon salt
- ¼ teaspoon mace
- ¼ teaspoon pepper
- 2 tablespoons grated Parmesan cheese

Place chicken and almonds in pie shell; then Swiss cheese. Beat eggs slightly in a medium bowl; blend in milk, salt, mace and pepper. Pour over cheese. Sprinkle on Parmesan cheese. Bake in a preheated 375° oven for 30-35 minutes or until a knife inserted near center comes out clean. Allow to stand 10 minutes before serving. 6 servings.

QUICHE LORRAINE

- 1 unbaked pie shell, 9-inch
- 4 eggs, slightly beaten
- 2 cups milk
- ½ teaspoon salt
- ¼ teaspoon dry mustard
- ¼ teaspoon white pepper
- 2 cups (8 oz.) shredded Swiss cheese
- 6 slices bacon, cooked and crumbled
- 2 tablespoons chopped green onion
- 2 tablespoons Parmesan cheese

Combine eggs, milk, salt, mustard and pepper in a bowl. Toss together cheese, bacon and onion; turn into a pie shell. Pour over milk mixture. Sprinkle with Parmesan cheese. In a preheated 375° oven bake at 35-40 minutes or until a knife inserted near center comes out clean. Allow to stand for 10 minutes before serving. 6 servings.

MILK MOCHA

- 2 quarts milk
- 6 tablespoons powdered chocolate drink*
- 6 tablespoons instant coffee
- ¼ cup light brown sugar, firmly packed
- 1 teaspoon vanilla extract

Combine milk, chocolate mix, instant coffee and sugar in a 3-quart saucepan. Heat to serving temperature, stirring occasionally. Add vanilla extract. Just before serving, beat with rotary beater until foamy.

Honey-Apricot Turkey Glaze

- 10 to 12 lb. turkey, cleaned and trussed
- melted butter or margarine
- 1/2 cup apricot or peach preserves
- 1/3 cup honey
- 1/3 cup Drambuie
- 2 tablespoons cornstarch

Place bird, breast side up, on rack in shallow roasting pan; brush with melted butter. Cover bird with foil tent. Roast at 325°F for about 4 hours or until a meat thermometer registers 185°F.

In saucepan combine preserves, honey and cornstarch. Cook until mixture thickens, stirring constantly. Remove from stove and stir in Drambuie.

Uncover bird and brush with Drambuie mixture during the last 30 minutes of roasting. Makes 8 to 10 servings.

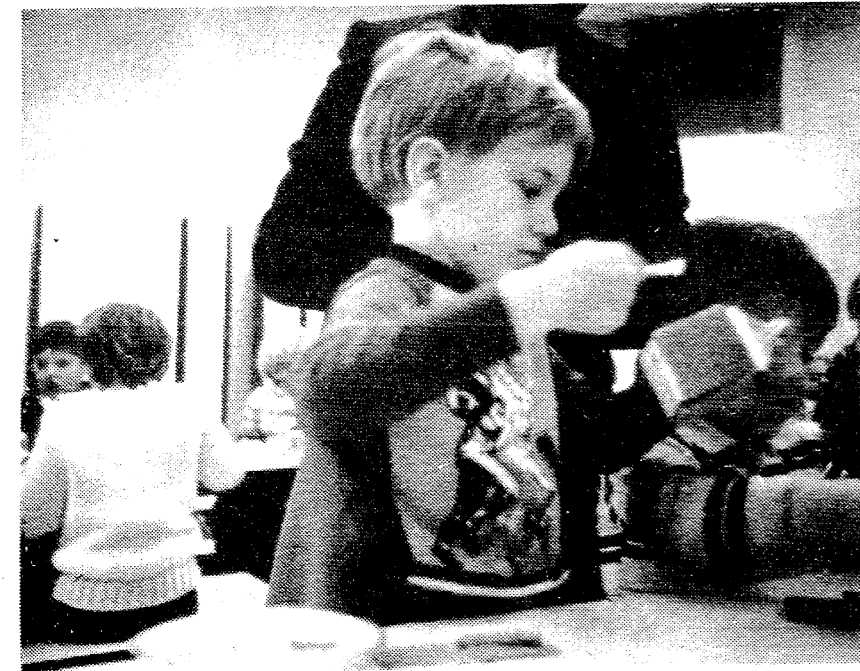

Gingerbread Houses Under Construction

The Klager Elementary School gym was filled with children, candy, smiles and frosting as students from the Primary Team and Mrs. Henry's class made individual gingerbread houses on Friday.

With lots of help from Moms', the children constructed their houses of graham crackers built around tiny milk cartons. When the structure was complete, each child painstakingly added candy and cookies to make doors, windows and roofs on their special masterpieces.

This project was one part of a study unit on Christmas customs in other lands.

Here's a "rule of thumb" formula to predict if you must pay the AMT. Total up your income. Then, total the amount you will deduct or exclude for long-term capital gains, incentive stock options, accelerated depreciation, and oil depletion allowances. If the sum of these tax breaks exceeds your taxable income, you may have to pay the AMT.

Let's say that you are single and have \$10,000 in wages and other income. In addition, you have a long-term capital gain of \$60,000 from a stock transaction. Since the \$96,000 you are entitled to exclude on a long-term capital gain (60 percent of \$60,000) is greater than your \$34,000 in taxable income (\$10,000 plus 40 percent of \$60,000), you will have to pay the AMT.

Before you explore year-end planning to avoid the worst effects of the AMT, it's essential to understand how the tax is calculated.

Taxable income under the AMT is computed by adding "tax preferable items" — there are about 20 — onto adjusted gross income. The major ones to add on are a 60 percent exclusion from a long-term capital gain, profits from employee stock options, accelerated depreciation excess of straight line depreciation and excess intangible drilling costs.

Next, subtract charitable contributions, casualty loss deductions or medical expenses in excess of 10 percent of your adjusted gross income, interest on mortgage payments and other allowable interest payments. Finally, subtract exemptions that

High Rollers May Have An "Alternative" On Taxes

Anyone fortunate enough to have a sizeable capital gain or depreciation deduction in 1984 may still have time to blunt the effect of the Alternative Minimum Tax (AMT). The AMT is a special flat tax rate levied in cases when someone makes a lot of money but manages to keep the tax bill low by taking the utmost advantage of tax rules. This 20 percent rate can be burdensome.

Approximately one out of 10 people with income greater than

\$100,000 is potentially subject to the AMT. An executive who cashes in on incentive stock options, or an investor who purchases business property for the large accelerated depreciation write-offs, is a prime target of the AMT.

While there is time left to shield yourself from the AMT before the year-end, the Michigan Association of CPAs advises taxpayers to figure out if they will be affected by this tax, and how to plot a strategy for dealing with it.

apply to the AMT: \$40,000 for married persons filing jointly, \$20,000 for married couples filing separate returns and \$30,000 for all others.

Your AMT tax bill is a flat rate of 20 percent on the total arising

from these calculations. If your tax bill under the AMT formula is greater than your regular tax bill, you must pay the AMT. An IRS spokesman warns that taxpayers who should file the AMT but do not file will be picked up by a computer.

Someone who knows he will be

hit by the AMT may still have some year-end tax planning options to avoid it. You may, for instance, be able to sell some capital losses to offset a huge gain. But since so many different things can trigger the AMT, you may want to consult your tax advisor for a solution that fits

your particular situation. Taxpayers who pay their 1984 income taxes under the AMT must understand how the AMT affects deductions for casualty and theft losses, charitable contributions and interest payments. Basically, the AMT turns conventional year-end tax

strategy on its head. AMT taxpayers may find it advantageous to defer deductions and accelerate income where possible. Why? Under the regular tax formula, a person in the 50 percent tax bracket who pays \$15,000 in interest on loan payments would be entitled to a \$7,500 tax break.
