Law Prohibits Snow Dumping

Property owners piling snow high along roadways and shoulders or pushing it to the opposite side of the street without clearing debris can cause hazardous conditions for motorists, and the Michigan Department of Transportation (MDOT) warns that it's also

against the law. MDOT said state law (P.A. 82 of 1978) prohibits businesses and from dumping snow on roadways and shoulders or piling it so high at driveway entrances that it obstructs the vision of

The department recommends residents keep the shoulder in front of their driveways clear and also clear snow for a short distance from the driveway in the direction of approaching traffic.

"That way the view of a motorist entering the roadway from a driveway is not obstructed," explained Maurice E. Witteveen, MDOT's chief of

"When clearing your driveway," he said, "push the snow away from the roadway and to the sides of the driveway for its full length and the problem of the high snow banks blocking a driver's view will be eliminated."

Witteveen said large businesses should make special arrangements ahead of time to remove snow from their driveway entrances and driveways. In some cases it may be necessary to truck snow away from parking facilities.

Violators leave themselves open to fines and lawsuits for public liability and property damage. For a charge to be filed, a police officer must witness the violation or a citizen must file a complaint.

All property owners and persons hired to remove snow are responsible for maintaining safe traffic conditions and preventing careless snow-removal techniques.

Statement New Gives Direction For 1986

Year-end is a good time to take stock of your financial situation and draw up a personal financial statement. This will give you a good idea of where you stand and get the new year off to a good start. says the Michigan Association of CPAs (MACPA).

A personal financial statement can help you with tax and retirement planning, budgeting, investing and obtaining bank loans. It's a tool that can help you plan for growth and achieve your goals. After you've done it once, it'll be a cinch to update.

A personal financial statement tells you what you are worth. Your net worth is the excess of what you own over what you owe. If you owe more than you own, as many people do these days, you case, a personal financial because it will help you design a plan to change that situation.

To start writing a personal financial statement, list all that you own-your assets-in a single column. Items include cash on hand or in deposit accounts, IOUs, investments and any other money that is owed you. In addition, include the current value of your

Alongside each assets, increases in the market item, list the date and purchase price. This will help you compute any capital gain or loss if you sell

the asset.

In addition, if you have money tied up in closely-held businesses. show it in single amounts. Don't try to break down a company's financial situation within your statement. That will only blur the picture. If you have an Individual Retirement Account or a Keogh retirement account, list the cash value minus the penalty you would have to pay if withdrew the money today.

In another column, list all your liabilities—what you owe. It might be unpleasant, but include all your debts and outstanding bills, such statement is especially important as charge accounts. Don't forget your tax obligations, the unpaid balance on your mortgage and any outstanding personal loans.

For an easy yet impressive Yuletide meal, serve a beef rib roast with spicy orange garnishes.

Beef Rib Roast 6 to 8-pound beef rib roast (2 to 3 ribs) Place roast, fat side up, on rack in open roasting pan. Insert meat thermometer so bulb is centered in the thickest part of roast. Do not add water. Do not cover. Roast in 325°F (slow) oven to desired degree of doneness. Allow 23 to 25 minutes per pound for rare, 27 to 30 for medium and 32 to 35 for well done. Allow roast to "stand" 15 to 20 minutes in a warm place before carving. Roasts continue to rise about 5°F in temperature to reach 140°F for rare; 160°F medium; 170°F for well done.
