on the client's job behavior. For instance, clients may talk 100 words per minute while trying to work, shout across the floor or become upset with minor changes. said Anne Goodell, contract procurer for the Development Parks holds classes to train

clients in hygiene and job seeking The classes use role

playing to prepare clients for job interviews. The workshop's funding comes

from three sources. Washtenaw County Community Mental Health pays a daily fee for each client. Contract work with businesses such as Manchester Stamping also bring in money.

A third source comes from Washtenaw Interventions. Intervention received a grant for \$91,000 from Michigan Rehabilitation Services which is used to fund the

"This has beloed our compan to be able to do assemblies competitive to do this and frees up space in our plant. It also gives these people an opportunity to learn to work and to make living," said Hamilton. "This is truly an experiment. If



But, you may be more familiar with Morley candy than you think - many schools, churches and associations sell Morley's finest and sweetest as a fundraising venture. In fact, the director of our promotion office swears she sold Morley candy door-to-door twenty years ago as a school fundraising project in Portland, Oregon! company maintains a warehouse and distribution center in Arizona for wholesale sales for that very

The Morley candymakers have been at it for a long time, beginning in 1919, in the cramped kitchen of founder Erwin Morley's flat above his soda and mait shop on Detroit's lower east side.

The shop was a popular teen hangout during its heyday in the '40's and '50's - a great place for the kids from the nearby high schools to sip a soda and watch the hotrods cruising Gratiot. As a matter of fact, the shop could have served as a set for "Happy Days", complete with a lot of kids who looked like the Fonz and his friends, lounging in piano veneer booths under a pounded tin ceiling with rotating fans. Ha-a-a-y!

The success of the shop (and Morley's candies) paved the way for the move to the new \$2.5 million candy factory on Nine Mile in 1961. Morley retired four years later and turned over the business to his sons Erwin, Jr. and Thomas, who had bussed tables in the "old Place" on Gratiot.

Today the sons (and grandsons) of Erwin Moriey are carrying on the tradition. Visitors often see them on the other side of the big kitchen window-wall, helping out the 60 other Morley candymakers who also are part of the tradition. In any case, let's keep making it - and buying it - in Michigan!
