Another object born in 1886 which had a far reaching effect on all our lives was the Linotype Machine. This piece of machinery revolutionized the whole business of printing and made the printed word available to all at a price that they could afford.

For quite a number of years prior to this date many inventors had spent much time and money developing a mechanical typesetting method. Several machines for this purpose had been constructed and several fortunes spent in the unsuccessful development of such a machine.







Fort St. Joseph Tricentennial

Fort St. Joseph, the first white settlement in St. Clair County, was established by the French in 1686. The fort represented an alliance between French explorers and the several hundred Indian allies. The fort was active for two years, then used as a trading post for French settlers until 1701. A six-part video presentation on the establishment and history of the fort is now being produced by the Clair County Intermediate School District and funded by MCH. The tapes feature actors representing major groups from the period, including a native American woman, a fur trader, a farmer's wife, a soldier and a cleric/missionary.
