On Tuesday, December 9, 1986, The Village of Manchester voters authorized Village Council to issue bonds for a new Wastewater

Total voter turnout was 175. On issue #1, 147 voted yes and 28 voted no. This was the question on the Treatment Plant at \$2,200,000.

Issue #2 asked for permission to finance water and sewer improvements, 167 voted, 140 voted yes and 27 voted no.

It is evident that the community is badly in need of and in total support of the improvements. The Village is hopeful of an EPA gardening information. grant, but it is as of yet unclear of the official status. We should know of the status within one month. One year ago the Village developed an innovative design that could bring 70% funding.

If a grant is not offered the Village may have a difficult time selling bonds. The annual requirement, including existing debit and AM&R, could make the bonds not marketable without grant

Donations Sought

School District wants to make sure residents are aware that, as an educational institution, gifts the district are deductible. Win the new tax law changes that go into effect on January 1, 1987, many people may be looking for ways to lower their taxable income by December 31, 1986. One such option would be charitable donation.

Because of the current tax laws, donations made prior to December 31, 1986 have certain tax advantages. A percentage of the contribution is actually returned to the donor with the Federal Refund. The percentage returned depends on a person's tax bracket and in many cases can be a substantial amount. This means that the acutal 'out of pocket' expense is much less than the original face value of your gift. A quick check with your accountant or tax preparer is advised.

In any case, your local school district should not be overlooked as a qualifying institution for charitable donations. Gifts can be mailed directly to: Financial Officer. Manchester Community Schools, 710 East Main. Manchester, Michigan 48158. Those wishing to personally deliver contributions are encouraged to stop by the Superintendent's Office between 8:00 a.m. and 4:30 p.m. any school day. 





Congressman Carl D. Pursell says top government officials don't need a pay raise and has vowed to 'It doesn't stand to reason that

we call for a pay hike for a select about the need to cut spending and reduce the national deficit, said Pursell, R-Plymouth. 'While I can appreciate some of

Congress.'

The federal commission, in report sent to President Reagan Monday, called for a top federal salary of \$135.000 a year - an

almost 75 percent increase.

The commission reviewed the salaries of more than 3,000 top officials - including the vice cabinet members, agency directors and federal judges.

"It has been estimated that each 10 percent increase in top officials' salaries costs us about \$100 million. If that's true, we're looking at a pay hike plan with a more than \$700 million price tag we can't afford it," Pursell said.

"The idea that officials can't live on incomes already five times greater than that of the average American worker is absurd." the Congressman said.

Lebkuchen Cookies 11/4 cups light brown sugar 34 cup runny honey 1 egg, beaten 1 tsp. grated orange peel 1 thsp, orange juice 11/2 cups all-purpose flour 1/2 tsp. each: ground cinnamon, ground cloves, mace and ginger

tsp. baking soda 2 oz. ground almonds 3/4 cup chopped candied peel 1/4 cup glace cherries

6 oz. whole blanched almonds Over low heat melt honey and sugar together. Cool. Beat in grated peel, orange juice and egg. Sift flour, baking soda, salt and spices into large bowl; stir in the honey mixture, the ground almonds and orange peel. Keep overnight in refrigerator in greased aluminum foil. Take a fourth of the dough at a time from refrigerator; roll out to 3/8" thick on well-floured board. Cut into 21/2" rounds. Place well apart on baking sheet lined with baking parchment or oiled greaseproof

Put half a cherry in the middle and 4 almonds to make a flower on top. Bake 375° 10-12 minutes Cool on baking sheet. Store in airtight tin for week or two.

Christmas Diary Memories

Before becoming queen, Victoria, at age 13, wrote in her diary for December 24, 1832:

"After dinner we went upstairs. I then saw Flora, the dog which Sir John was going to give Mamma. Aunt Sophia came also. We then went into the drawing-room near the dining-room. After Mamma had rung a bell three times we went in. There were two large round tables on which were placed two trees hung with lights and sugar ornaments. All the presents being placed round the tree.

"I had one table for myself and the Conroy family had the other together. Lehzen had likewise a little table. Mamma gave me a little lovely pink bag which she had worked with a little sachet likewise done by her; a beautiful little opal brooch and earrings, books, some lovely prints, a pink satin dress and a cloak lined with fur. Aunt Sophia gave me a dress which she worked herself, and Aunt Mary a pair of amethyst earrings. Lehzen a lovely musicbook. Victoire a pretty white bag worked by herself, and Sir John

"Mamma then took me up into my bedroom with all the ladies. There was my new toilet table with a white muslin cover over pink and all my silver things standing on it with a fine new lookingglass. I stayed up till half past 9."
