He also believed in their verbal inspiration - that the very words and tenses were authored by God (Mat. 5:18, Mat. 22:23-32). In Jesus' mind then, the Scriptures were not just a compilation ct human thoughts and opinions, but the very words of God revealed to

It has been rightly observed that any attempt to evade the evidence for Christ's view of the trustworthiness of scripture is as futile as a mathematician's attempt to prove that it is theoretically possible to dodge an avalanche. The statements of Christ presented in the Gospels form a great avalanche of cumulative evidence that cannot honestly be evaded. Did Jesus trust the Bible? The evidence is abundantly clear! To Him the Old authoritative, and inspired. To Him the teaching of the Scripture was the teaching of the living God. To Him what the Bible said God said!

Now-how does all this help us to answer our original question, "Can we trust the Bible?" I believe that understanding Jesus' view of Scripture is of the greatest importance to any Second, Jesus also believed that his Lord and God, and who seeks Christ as well!




