

Beware of Local Business Scheme

The Better Business Bureau/ Detroit and Eastern Michigan warns companies to be on the alert for a local business scheme. A number of complaints have been filed with the BBB against Shelly Business Service and its owner, Philip Theis. Theis sells promotional items, such as imprinted calendars, mugs, and pens to businesses.

Theis acts as a manufacturer's representative and according to complainants, requires a deposit or full payment at the time the merchandise is ordered. However, many businesses state that they never received the merchandise. When the address and telephone number appearing on the invoices were traced, it was discovered that they belonged to an answering service which no longer does business with Mr. Theis.

In an attempt to reach Theis for a response to these allegations, the Bureau mailed certified letters to his home and on Continued on page 14



Fall weather conditions also affect the Turner way the colors are exhibited by leaves.
Cool nights (below 45 degrees) and warm Geriatric Clinic nights, the sugars cannot be carried from a monthly support group for 764-2556. the leaves to other parts of the tree. From the sugar trapped in the leaves, the red pigment "anthocyanin" forms. This is why a tree may have a preponderance of red leaves on its south side - the side facing the warming autumn sun - the warm sun made the sugar, the cool nights trap-

ped it in the leaves. The dropping of the leaves - that which gives autumn the name of "fall" is caused by a change that takes piace in the leafstalk ("petiole") where it connects to the twig. As food-making stops, the leaf is slowly cut off from the rest of the tree by the growth of a layer of cells called "abscission layer." These cells form the twig, leaving a leaf scar in its place.

Rain Fails To Halt Highway Construction

weeks have slowed state highway construction in much of Michigan, but only one major project has been seriously affected, the Michigan Department Transportation (MDOT) reports.

Nearly daily rainfall throughout September temporarily shut down the grading operation on an eight-Lansing, delaying completion of the new freeway until next summer. The department had expected to open it to traffic by the end of this year.

Elsewhere, the downpours have set back construction work, but most of the nearly 30 major projects across the state should schedule, said Gerald J. Casey, MDOT chief construction engineer.

"We expect some bad weather for every job, and we program that into the schedules," he said. "Whether a project is seriously affected depends on the amount of rain, the type of job and the phase that the job is in."

The I-69 project which extends from US-27 north of Lansing east to near the Clinton-Shiawassee county line, is at a critical state where most of the work involves extensive earth moving.

"On a job like this," Casey said, "one day of rain will shut down the project for three or four days. We just haven't had enough drying-out time."

Tests Show Alar Safe, But Apple Crop Suffers

Even though recent test results show that it is safe to use the chemical daminozide, marketed under the trade name ALAR, much damage to the state's apple industry was caused by an earlier proposed ban, according to Tom Butler of the Michigan Processing Apple Growers.

ALAR, an agricultural chemical used to improve the quality and storage life of apples, became controversial last year when the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) proposed a ban on its use following a review of tests conducted in 1977. In unusual action, the EPA's scientific advisory panel concluded the tests supporting such a ban were seriously flawed, causing the agency to reexamine the issue and
