With the new tax law changes that go into effect on January 1, 1967, many people may be looking for ways to lower their taxable income by December 31, 1966. One such option would be a charitable donation.

Because of the current tax laws, donations made prior to December 31, 1966 have certain tax advantages. A percentage of the contribution is actually returned to the donor with the Federal Refund. The percentage returned depends on a person's tax bracket and in many cases can be a substantial amount. This means that the actual "out of pocket" expense is much less than the original face value of your gift. A quick check with your accountant or tax preparer is advised.

In any case, your local school district should not be overlooked as a qualifying institution for charitable donations. Gifts can be mailed directly to: Financial Officer, Manchester Community Schools, 710 East Main, Manchester, Michigan 48158. Those wishing to personally deliver contributions are encouraged to stop by the Superintendent's Office between 8:00 a.m. and 4:30 p.m. any school day. If these hours are not convenient, please call the office at 428-7300 and we will make arrangements for someone to be present.

Driving requires a combination of thought and motor skills, a great deal of common sense and a concern for the safety of everyone on the road. By mixing drugs or alcohol with driving you are only

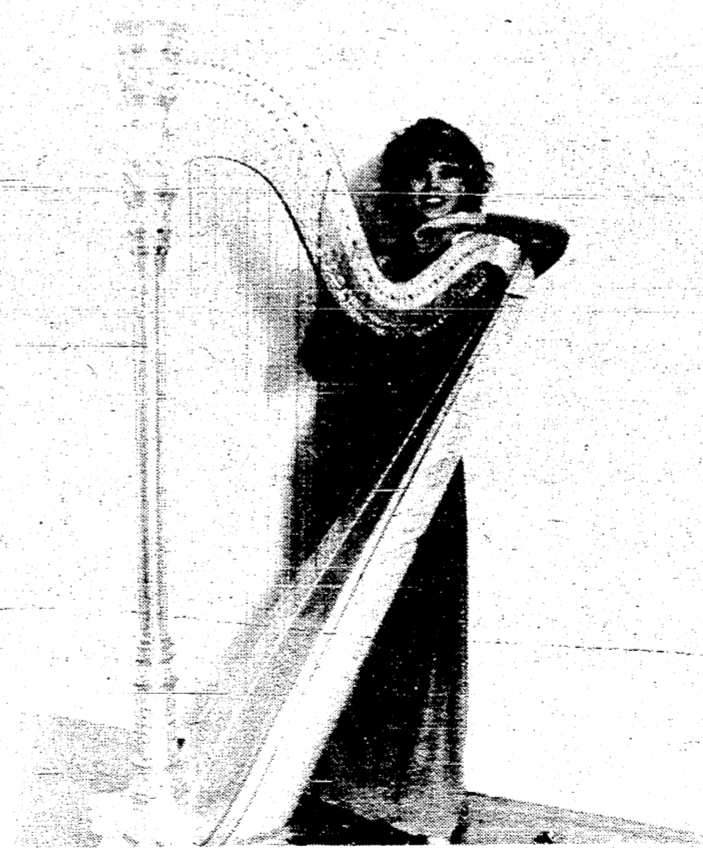
Pleasant Traveling

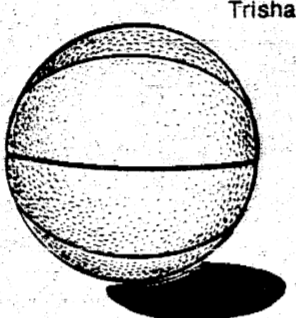

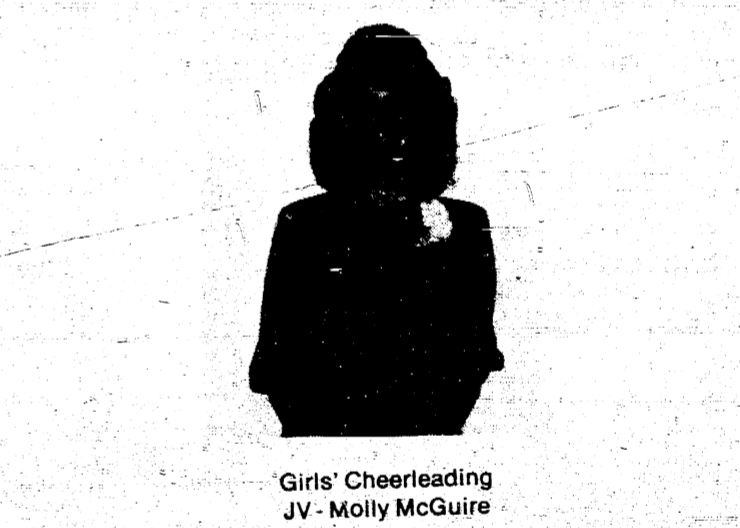

Fisheries Division To Hire 55 Employees

More than 600 persons have applied for 55 positions within the Fisheries Division of the Department of Natural Resources (DNR). Filling the positions will restore DNR fisheries staff to 1982 levels. Funding for the 55 positions was made possible by the passage of license fee increases approved by the Legislature last Spring which qualified the state for additional Federal funds.

The 55 positions include 42 existing vacancies for fisheries biologists, technicians and maintenance personnel and 13 newly created positions.

Each of the DNR's four Upper Peninsula District offices will be assigned on additional fisheries biologist. The remaining employees will be placed throughout the Lower Peninsula.

Extensive interviews are being conducted now through December. The 55 successful applicants are expected to be selected by late January, with an effective starting date of February, 1987. These added positions will bring the DNR's fisheries staff to 300.

These new hires will have a significant impact on our fisheries programs in the years ahead, said DNR Fisheries Chief John Scott, with particular emphasis on inland fisheries research and management throughout the state and expansion of Southern Michigan recreation fishing opportunities.

Major DNR Fisheries projects slated for 1987 include:

*Expansion of fishing/boating public access sites, including small boat and walk-in access, pier and shore fishing access and improved handicapper access.

*Construction of fish ladders or

trap and transfer facilities to move fish upstream on major rivers.

*Research fish community dynamics to determine and solve causes of panfish stunting.

*Continued reduction of non-game or nuisance fish populations in over populated lakes and streams.

*Expand plants of Walleye, Northern Pike, Muskie and Bass on large river systems and inland lakes.

*Increase public awareness of DNR Fisheries programs and work more with anglers to determine their needs. Increase delivery of fishing information and promote fishing in Michigan.

*Create a grant-in-aid program to assist local government and conservation organizations to sponsor inland fisheries development and habitat protection projects.

*In cooperation with conservation organizations, designate and develop management policies and programs to protect the state's top quality 'blue ribbon' trout streams.

*Commence planning to modernize Marquette and Oden hatcheries and make improvements at other hatchery facilities.

Beware of Open Water/Thin Ice

The Michigan State Waterways Commission warns the public that open water or thin ice conditions will exist this winter with the installation of deicing devices at six state-operated Lake Huron harbors and possibly some Great Lakes municipal marinas.

One-hundred seventy-two propeller-like deicing agitators are being installed by the Department of Natural Resources (DNR) through December 14, at six of the 13 state-operated harbors. These devices will prevent ice damage to piers, catwalks and shoreline bulkheads caused by increasing and record Great Lakes water levels.

The Commission has strongly recommended each of the 55 municipal marinas situated along the Great Lakes take appropriate action to protect their structures also.

Agitators will be installed at the following Lake Huron harbors: Mackinac Island, St. Ignace, Hammond Bay, East Tawas, Port Austin and Lexington. These six harbors

face imminent damage from ice if precautionary measures are not taken.

The deicing devices will be installed two to three feet below water adjacent to piers, catwalks, and bulkheads at each of the six harbors. Agitators installed in local harbors will be similarly located. Since their purpose is to either totally melt ice or to keep the ice thin enough so as not to pose a threat to the docks, these areas should be avoided by persons fishing, snowmobiling, or otherwise using the ice for support.

The agitators will be removed next spring as the ice dissipates. The Department intends to conduct a survey of each of the harbors and marinas at which agitators were installed to determine the operational success of these devices.
