## Free Immunizations



Paternal grandparents are Harb and Verna Pabst of Aurora, Colorado.

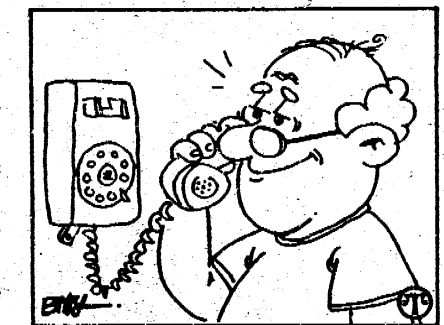
Bruce Anthony Woodward
