If you are going overseas however, you should definitely convert some cash to foreign currency at a U.S. bank so that you will have money to pay for cabs and food when you arrive at your destination. Keep in mind, too, that if you arrive on a weekend, you will need enough foreign currency to carry you through Monday morning when the local banks re-open. You can, of course, convert funds at the airport or hetel, but you will usually receive the best exchange rates at a bank.

CPAs also suggest that you take at least one credit card with you on your trip. Most bank cards are accepted at millions of establishments around the world. What's more, if the card is lost or stolen, your liability is generally limited to \$50. And if you have personal identification numbers (PINs) for your credit or bank cards, you may be able to use them to obtain cash from the automatic teller machines located in airports and banks worldwide.

It may be difficult to imagine in an age of fax machines and television, but for hundreds of years the seas and the ships that sailed them were the main avenues of communication in the civilized world.


Ships carried not only tangible goods, letters, trade records and other documents but also news. attitudes, belief systems and

Evidence for such assertions is on display at the University of Michigan's William L. Clements Library through July 31, in an exhibit titled "Life at Sea in the Age of Sail."

Dann's longtime interest in the writings of Jacob Nagle, a sailor and diarist of the late-18th and early-19th centuries, the exhibit includes letters, invoices, newspapers, maps, journals, broadsides, cartoons and even pistols from the era, documenting the environments and events that made up the daily life of the seafarer.

The Clements Library, located at 909 S. University Ave., is open weekdays 10:30 a.m.-noon and 1-5 p.m. The exhibit is free and open to the public.


