

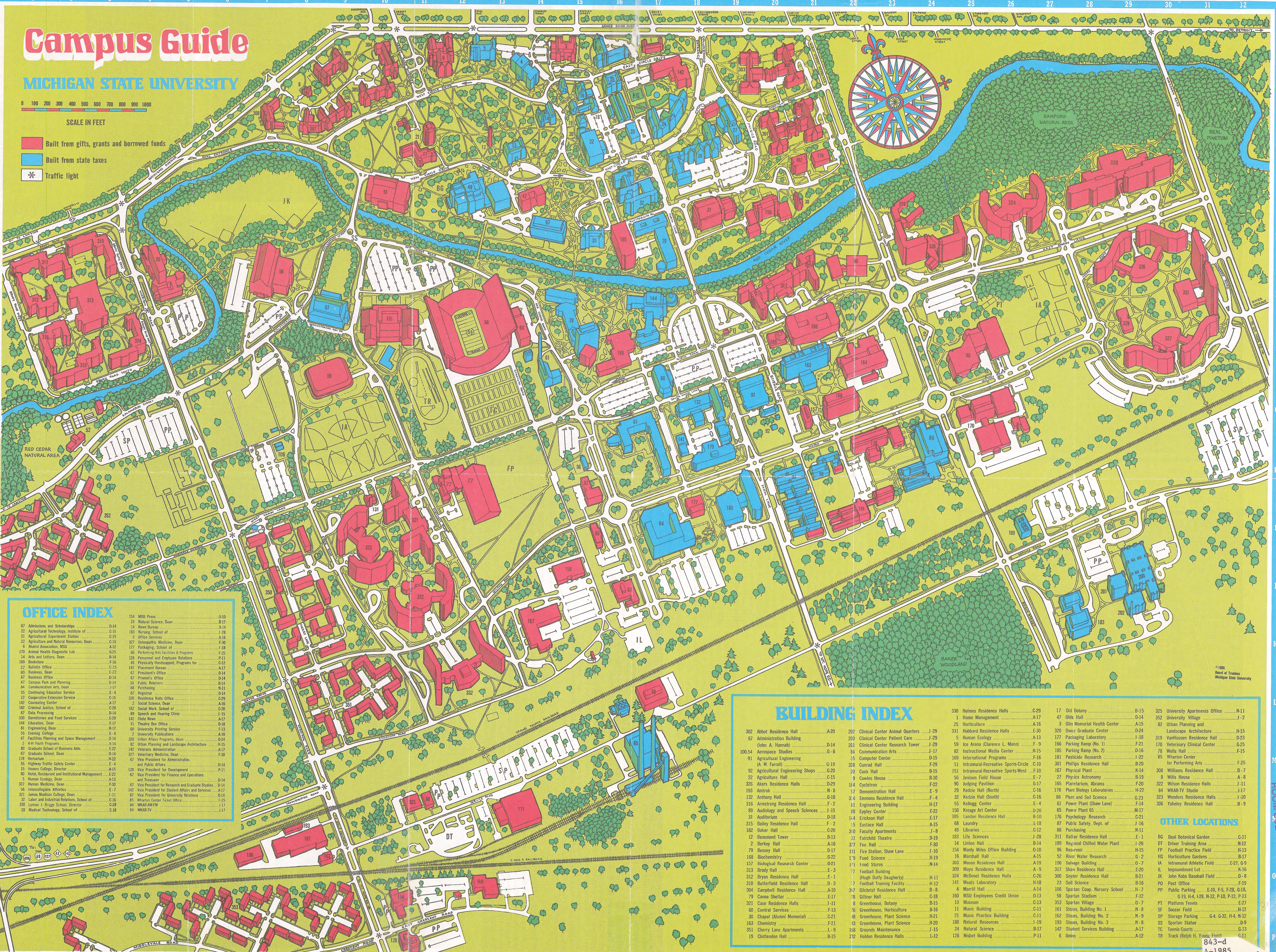
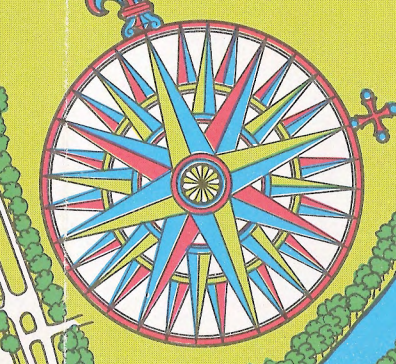

## Attractions for Campus Visitors

### MSU UNION 6

The many services available at this community center include a cafeteria, store, conference and banquet facilities, bowling alley, and more.

### KREEGE ART MUSEUM 9

A gift from the Kreege Foundation, the center contains a gallery where the public is invited to see outstanding faculty and student art and photographic shows. A fine permanent collection is augmented by traveling exhibits, on loan from some of the nation's finest galleries. Open weekdays, except Tuesday, 9:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m.; Tuesdays, noon to 8 p.m.; Saturdays and Sundays, 1 to 4 p.m. Reduced hours during summer.

### ABRAMS PLANETARIUM 10

The planetarium, housing one of the most advanced star projectors, has an exhibit hall and blacklight gallery open to the public on weekdays from 8:30 a.m. to noon and 1 to 4:30 p.m. Public programs in the 252-seat sky theater are Friday and Saturday evenings and Sunday afternoons. ### INTERNATIONAL PROGRAMS CENTER 11

A unique feature of this building is the furniture used by the delegates to the historic state constitutional convention of 1862-63. The original setting has been reproduced as closely as possible. Besides providing a center for international programs, the building contains seminar-lecture rooms, offices, the MSU Bookstore and the Crossroads Cafeteria.

### FOREST AKERS GOLF COURSES 12

The 18-hole west course is located on 150 acres west of Harrison Road. The 18-hole east course is located directly east of Harrison Road. ### OFF-CAMPUS PLACES TO VISIT

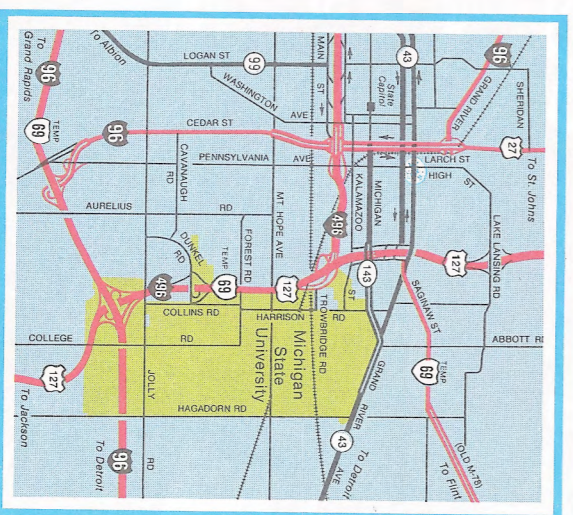
**KEILLOG BIOLOGICAL STATION**, located on Gull Lake near Battle Creek and Kal-Amazon, covers an area of more than 2,000 acres. It includes a bird sanctuary, a farm, and a demonstration forest. Visitors especially enjoy the bird sanctuary.

**HIDDEN LAKE GARDENS**, located in the scenic Irish Hills of southeastern Michigan at Tipton, exhibits valuable plant collections and creates landscape arrangements for the visitor's enjoyment. Tropical, arid, and temperate plant collections may be seen in the conservatory complex.

### to Michigan State University.

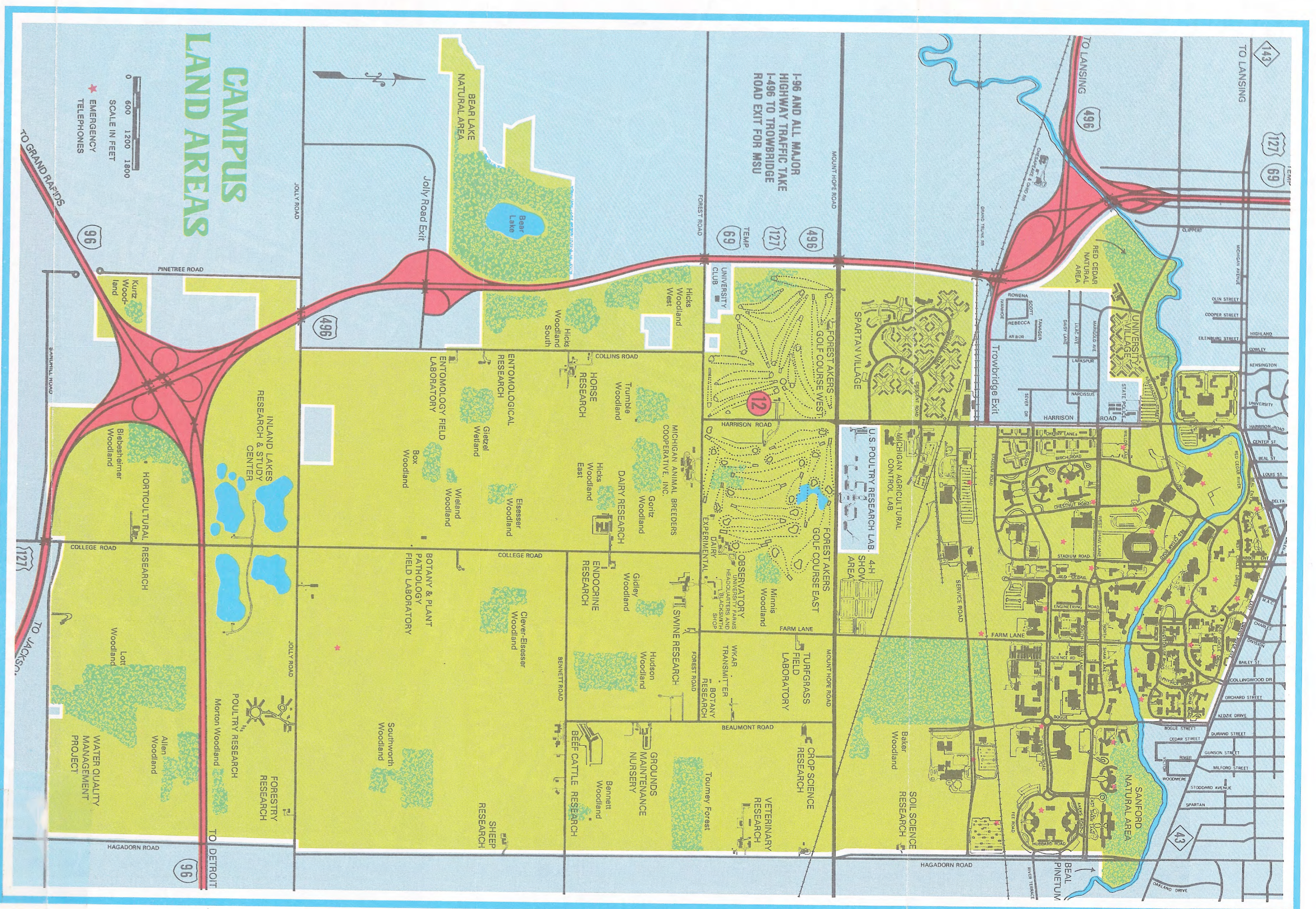
