Nevertheless, of those who did cast their votes, 86 per cent were in favour, so there seems to be little doubt as to the general wish for unity among greenkeepers.

Once again, we will be limited to the numbers of delegates. This year's conference was over-subscribed and those who left their applications until the last minute, had to be turned away.
