The journey

arly in 1994 we embarked on a journey which was to take us through the whole ambit of BIGGA's structure and activities at national, regional and section level by means of a review which has resulted in the completed 'Towards 2000" document. This journey will end in Harrogate at our forthcoming AGM when members will be asked to approve the document and most importantly implement the resulting amendments proposed to the Constitution and Rules of the Association.

Looking back, the exercise over the past two years has seen the democratic processes of the Association at their best. All members with an interest in commenting on the review should have had the opportunity to do so through their sections. At regional level there has been a proper and considered consultation on the proposed changes and representations made to the Board of Management for consideration. Over and above this a Review Body was established which in addition to the Headquarters Management included our Chairman and representatives from each of the regions. This Review Body was instrumental in progressing the "Towards 2000" document and I would like to thank those member representatives who gave freely of their time - Barry Heaney, Gordon Child, Ian Holoran, Harry Diamond, Clive Osgood and Richard Barker.

So we come to the AGM with the review document having broad based support from the sections of the Association and the five regional boards. The focus is now on the proposed amendments to the Constitution and Rules and space will not allow me to comment in detail in the course of this article. I will, however, make mention of two key aspects of the changes. One relates to membership of the Association and seeks to give a clearer definition of the entitlement to full membership of BIGGA. This, in future, if accepted, will be limited to "any person employed in the keeping of the green at a golfing establishment" together with Life Members duly elected by the Association in General Meeting. Other membership categories will continue with the introduction also of a "Student Member" category. Existing members who feel they may no longer meet the criteria for full member-



ship have no need for concern as a separate clause allows for those persons in paid up membership of the Association at the time of implementation of the revised Constitution by the membership in General Meeting and who do not meet the new criteria for membership as laid down in that Constitution to continue in membership at the discretion of the appropriate section committee.

A second key aspect of the changes relates to the Board of Management which, on acceptance of the proposals, will henceforth comprise of five members being one member from each region, together with a Chairman, Vice-Chairman and Past Chairman. An important change is that the Chairman and Vice-Chairman can be appointed by the Board from within the full membership of the Association. Should the Board appoint from within the five regional members then the region in question shall be entitled to elect an additional representative. So the Board of Management will be restricted to eight members. The introduction of a clause allowing the Board to appoint a Chairman and Vice-Chairman from within the full membership rather than restricting those appointments to members of the board as currently applies is important. It will allow a much greater degree of flexibility and should ensure that those taking on the positions in future can give freely of their time and commit themselves wholly to positions where the demands are ever-increasing.

I hope I have given you just a brief insight to the changes being proposed and that members attending the AGM will see fit to vote in these amendments to our Constitution and Rules. Looking

towards 2000 and beyond, I believe that they will increase the standing and effectiveness of the Association as we look to meet the many challenges that lie ahead.

A welcome for new Golden and Silver Key members

BIGGA'S Education and Development Fund was established in January 1992 and is now entering its fifth year. Its achievements are well documented and it has been particularly successful on two fronts. First in providing education and training opportunities for our members which otherwise would not have been possible and secondly in bringing together, through a common programme, those companies within the industry who wish to support greenkeepers in their quest to enhance their knowledge and learning opportunities and to take forward the status of the profession. 1995 saw the publication of "A Practical Guide to the Ecological Management of the Golf Course" as well as a new training video on "Golf Course Preparation". Both were made possible through the resources of the Fund as were the Regional Management Training Courses which will continue across the country and in Southern Ireland during the coming spring. A number of projects for 1996 are being planned and during the BTME in Harrogate we will be launching another new video on the 'Reconstruction of a Green'. The Fund has therefore become a keystone of our progress as an Association and within this magazine we recognise and thank those companies as Golden and Silver Key Members who will be supporting the Fund in 1996. A mention also for those individuals who choose to support the Fund and become Golden or Silver Key members of the Association. This is a very real commitment to the education and training of greenkeepers and I thank them for their support.

A special welcome for our new Golden Key company members – Hepworth Minerals and Chemicals Ltd, Pattisson, Mommersteeg, Levington, Superturf and Ocmis. A welcome too for Rolawn as a Silver Key member. I feel sure that their decisions to support the Fund will be fully justified and I look forward to their playing a full part in the consultative processes through which the Fund and the projects emanating from it have prospered.

INEWS

End of an era

At the end of a year in which he prepared his fourth Open Championship course Walter Woods, Links Superintendent at St Andrews, begins his well earned retirement – although the pipe, slippers and SAGA holiday brochures may have to wait a while before they are put to good use because he has no intention of saying farewell to the profession he loves.

Walter will remain as a consultant to St Andrews Links and will expand his consultancy work to share his vast experience with others.

"I go into clubs where the greenkeeper is suffering stress and without the resources to do the job properly and try to provide him with support. I find that the committee listens to me and I can usually improve the situation for the greenkeeper within a couple of months," he explained. As the first Chairman of BIGGA in 1987 Walter has seen the Association grow and been a major influence in what it has done for the profession.

"I see a different type of greenkeeper coming through. One who has a responsible job, is in charge of budgeting and who has a more managerial role. The Association is largely responsible for this and is keen to promote the job of the greenkeeper and point the way

forward for the profession."

He also gave credit to the Association for improving the image of the greenkeeper.

"It used to be that greenkeepers wore overalls and a 'bunnet' but now you see young men who still wear overalls while out on the course but who dress in their BIGGA blazer, collar and tie when they have meetings. That has done a lot for the image of greenkeeping and the Association has been responsible for that."

One thing which does annoy him, however, is the Association's current membership level.

"We have moved up from

1,000 members when we first started to 6,000 now but we should have 12,000 members.

"Every greenkeeper should be a member of BIGGA and it is down to the clubs to learn that the course won't succeed without a good greenkeeper and that a good greenkeeper should be a member of the Association to tap into all the expertise and educational opportunities it has to offer."

If there is one thing which has surprised and delighted Walter since the birth of BIGGA it is the education which is now on offer.

"I didn't think it would ever happen that many greenkeepers would be better educated than the secretaries but it has because the Association not only educates on greenkeeping matters but offers courses in management as well."

After 21 years at St Andrews Walter will miss preparing the courses for Championships.

"Not just the Opens but the other professional events and the top amateur championships. I got a real buzz out of that," he recalls.



Out to grass...

The revelation that it takes 15 years to develop a new variety of grass was just one of the interestpieces of information revealed at the South West and South Wales Region Seminar at Cannington College in Bridgewater. Somerset.

Sponsored by Barenbrug the day was introduced by John Bradley, Area Manager of Barenbrug UK Ltd who reminded the delegates of a passage from Jonathan Swift's Gulliver's Trav-

"And he gave it for his opinion that whoever could make two ears of corn or two blades of grass to grow upon a spot of ground where only one grew before, would deserve better of mankind and do more essential service to his country than the whole race of politicians put

The talks began with "Perennial rye grass for the golf green in the year 2005" by Gerard van t'Klooster, Head of Breeding in Holland who explained the work behind developing new varieties

and getting them to a state where they are ready to be marketed.. He was followed by John Linneker, Manager of Royal North Devon GC who spoke on "Golf Club Management". His advice to managers was "not to punish every mistake that people make".

Cannington College HND student John Wilson took the day up to coffee with his talk on "Work experience on an American golf course" from his time at Sahali Golf and Country Club near Seattle. He gave golf clubs something to think about with the fact that the club spent £10,000 per annum on employee meals.

After coffee Mike Canaway, Chief Executive of the STRI spoke on "Research today for the needs of tomorrow" and gave an insight as to the work currently been under taken at Bingley. He was followed by Mark Anderson, a student of Sparsholt College and Head Greenkeeper at Newbury within a racecourse" who talked of the problems he had encountered which included concrete creeping its way to the surface of the course making vertidraining

After lunch Dr Anne-Maria Brennan, ecologist for the EGU talked on "On course conservation, golf and nature in partnership" and gave a tip on the building of ponds. "Treat wildlife like novice swimmers and give them a shallow end and no steep

George Shiels closed the seminar with his talk on "The presentation of a golf course form an agronomist's point of view". The day was rounded up by South West and South Wales Regional Administrator Gordon Child, who, along with wife Marion, had organised the day.

Golf Club on "A golf course Keeping the course open for 52 weeks of the year

"If golfers want to play all-yearround they must accept that vital preventative maintenance has to be carried out in the summer months and must accept the disruption that goes with it", so says Martyn Jones, Head of the Turf Section at Myerscough College.

"Fusarium can be largely prevented by summer treatments; aeration is most effective when carried out in the summer when the grass plants are most in need of oxygen and overseeding is most successful in the late summer when good germination is guaranteed and Poa annua less likely to thrive".

Martyn Jones was speaking at an evening Greenkeeping Seminar and Supper at Mere Golf and Country Club.

Mike Sheehan, Course Manager, explained that at Mere they now have an established policy to hollow core and top dress at the beginning of August. Disruption at this time of year is minimal and usually within two weeks all evidence of the treatments have disappeared. Competitions are arranged round this programme and generally a large percentage of the golfers are on holiday then anyway. Delegates from Davyhulme Golf Club and Prestbury hollow core in August with excellent results.

Dennis Mortram from Reaseheath College spoke on aeration and he too advocates summer treatments to prevent problems in winter rather than waiting until the course is waterlogged. He reminded the delegates that they don't manage the grass - they manage the soil. And if that soil is compacted or waterlogged then vital oxygen is restricted and the grass will not thrive. He also made a plea for more research into the whole subject of aeration.

A lively Question & Answer session covered topics ranging from the benefits of sand based greens, to the optimum number of competitions for an average course; overseeding; compaction and the difference between a Head Greenkeeper and a Course Manager.

90 delegates attended from 44 North West clubs, nearly half of whom were Chairmen of Green or Committee members.

The evening was organised by SISIS Equipment and jointly sponsored by SISIS and Rhône Poulenc.

Hugh Tilley canvasses opinion on a selection of Greens Mowers currently on the market

Greens mowers are always the first machine anyone thinks of when considering golf course machinery. Perhaps they are the glamour machines because they are in such frequent use, or maybe it because they have the most important visual impact on the course.

Most greenkeepers prefer to use pedestrian operated machines, however, many admit that ride-on greens triples offer time and labour savings and have to be used to greater or lesser extend on most courses. Whether there is any significant difference between quality of cut is debatable, perhaps the greatest difference is visual – the width of those highly desirable stripes.

Groomers, conditioners or rakes are available for most if not all greens machines, and most greenkeepers either love or hate them. Most groomers only work in a straight line - which may be a problem for the perimeter cut, few people are prepared to lift them just for one or two circles of the green. Verti-cutter reels are also an option for many machines, however as these require the cutting unit to be changed most greenkeepers prefer to have a dedicated machine for the task although changing

reels may be very quick and easy. The Dennis cassette system is the ultimate in quick change, and perhaps this could be adopted on other machines.


Without doubt quality of cut is the number one criteria in selecting machines with cuts per metre (or yard) the salient figure to consider however the greenkeepers spoken to accepted that a machine sold as a "greens mower" would provide acceptable cut quality. After this other considerations have to be price, reliability, service back-up and ease of use, including of adjusting. Again most greenkeepers took it for granted that the main contenders in this field would be easy to use and reliable. Service back-up was more important in this survey than in any of the previous ones, probably because the greens mower is the mainstay of maintenance – and appearance, not to mention green speed.

Greens vary considerably between clubs, and often between different parts on the same course. The size of the greens, their level and the surrounds have a significant impact on the ease of using a mower on them. Manoeuvrability is more vital on some courses than on others, while some have a greater requirement for machines with better than average stability and surefootedness. Greens triples have no tread or rib on tyres or rollers, and engine braking and/or all wheel drive may be required.

The Hayter Beaver T93 at Peterstone GC, South Wales

A troubled financial history, i.e. lack of money for investment, was the most critical factor in Peterstone's purchase of the Hayter T93. The five year old 18 hole private course is in receivership, however consultants advised of the necessity of maintaining the course, and thus the need to invest. A number of different machines were demonstrated, however the T93 supplied through local dealer Ted Hopkins (who took the old GT as a trade-in) performed perfectly satisfactorily and was available "at a price we couldn't refuse," said Philip Bowes, joint Head Greenkeeper.





hours on the clock, Philip commented that it has proved itself to be an extremely reliable and efficient machine which had never let them down. Pedestrian machines are only used in special circumstances, such as for matches.

The grooming reels were supplied with the machine and Philip commented that he would not have bought without them. In his opinion the machine gave "an excellent quality of cut especially when considered against its cost". Standard bottom blades are used with life and cost both acceptable. The reels are normally sharpened just once during the winter and then back-lapped "as and when necessary" during the cutting season. Philip was very pleased with the way the reels kept their cut and adjustment.

Ease of use, operating and manoeuvring, was considered to be equal to any other greens triple, four of the five greenkeepers use the machine regularly and all like it.

A couple of reel bearings have had to be replaced, using original parts from Hayter as these are "not over priced".

Philip's brother, and joint Head Greenkeeper, Greg said that Hayter had been extremely supportive and re-welded without quibble one minor crack in the frame. The machine still has all its original hydraulic pipework which has never leaked, although one internal seal in the transmission had to be replaced.

"No" said both Bowes brothers, "we can't fault the Hayter T93 and we'd certainly consider another".

Ransomes E-Plex at Lydney GC, Gloucestershire

"It'll be interesting to compare costs after a year's use," said Graham Wissett, Head Greenkeeper at Lydney in Gloucestershire. "Not having engine or hydraulic oil and filters to replace nor any diesel fuel to buy must make a considerable cost saving," he suggested. Lydney bought the all electric E-plex after an extended one month trial, the machine having first been R S Bird Ltd's demonstration machine.

Lydney is a private 9 hole course on relatively level ground between the town and the Severn. Graham admitted that he wouldn't have bought the machine without this long trial period. He suggested that this was the only way to buy any machine particularly if it was radically different to other machines you are used to. Certainly the radical concept and untried principle gave him initial cause for concern, but use has refute this concern.

"Its not a machine which will suit everyone," he suggested, "however it has proved to be ideal for our needs. You soon forget how it is powered." The E-Plex has now proved that it will cut 29 greens between charges and still have enough power to get back to its battery charger.

While knowing that it was an untried machine and principle, Graham was confident in the support he would receive from Ransomes and Birds, and added inducement was given by the fact that Birds gave a three years (free) service contract with it. The most obvious advantages of the machine apart from its economy of operation are its quietness. With a housing estate alongside the course the advantage when going out to cut greens at 5.30am is obvious. Other significant advantages are the lack of oils to spill and the minimal maintenance requirement. Graham said it was nice not to have to check oils and water or for worn pipes nor to have to wear ear defenders.

Power is provided by a bank of eight 6 volt batteries. Battery life is still an unknown quantity, Ransomes recommend replacing batteries in rotation, however Graham intends to wait until they go down and then to replace them all, using a local battery supplier at a cost estimated at £500. Following recommendations Lydney run the batteries almost "flat" before recharging, using the machine as a run-around if necessary. Charging takes about seven hour, i.e. overnight and once plugged in is automatic.

The E-Plex has a charge meter on the dash, and Graham said that reel speed, and so quality of cut, remains constant "until the batteries are virtually dead – the

reel drives being the priority service." Quality of cut is considered to be at least as good as any other greens mower. Furthermore the machine has stayed "on cut" exceptionally well without needing any resharpening. The service which does show charge level is reel lift, "you notice this getting sluggish as the charge runs down," Graham said. Slopes do have some effect on the machine, and speed can be reduced by as much as 30% when climbing. There is no engine braking when going downhill but Graham is happy to use the brakes if necessary to check forward speed. He believes that Ransomes have made a modification to this.

The machine has been used without turf groomers for the past season, however these are to be fitted for the next. Lydney checked the ability of the electric lift to cope with the extra weight – by loading 50kgs of sand into the boxes. Verti-cutters are not available. Individual units can be switched off allowing narrower and offset perimeter cuts to be made. Lift height stops are adjustable by screwdriver to ensure that the units come up just sufficiently high enough to clear humps

There are some downsides to the machine, one is that there is no power steering, however Graham said this is no real problem, you just develop different techniques, wider sweep turns and a three point turn if necessary, this has eliminated steering (skid) marks. Another expressed wish was for a sprung seat.

Overall Graham said, "I think the design is brilliant, exceptionally well though out with easy service swing out cutting units, only a single spanner for all adjustments. Certainly if it were stolen tomorrow I would buy another and I don't think that I will have a different opinion in a year's time."

Toro 3200-D at Wimbledon Common GC

When Greenkeeper International visited Ron Green, Head Greenkeeper at Wimbledon the machine had not been delivered. It had been ordered without demonstration, nor had Ron seen the machine, its specification or even a brochure. This indicated the club's faith in manufacturer and dealer - Ian Kerry Machinerv. But the machine was not an entirely unknown quantity as the club has had several previous Toro greensmasters. Where there was a little apprehension was over delivery as the club's Toro 3000 which was sold in part exchange has already gone, however Ron is confident that Ian Kerry "will see them right".

The club is in the unusual position of being joint private user of a public course - shared with the London Scottish Golf Club on the Common. Greenkeeping costs are divided equally. Policy is decided by a ten strong committee, five from each club with a Course Liaison Manager providing the link. Course staffing is three, including Ron with maintenance being based at the Wimbledon Common club premises. This tight staffing level means they have to have reliable machinery and depend on the supplier for service. Ron could not be more complimentary over the service given by Ian Kerry Machinery.

Servicing is scheduled monthly by Ian Kerry Machinery who do all oil changes and fully check the machine at that time, They undertake such repair and replacement, including sharpening, as deemed necessary. Backlapping is undertaken when required, probably about fortnightly.

The new machine replaced a Toro 3000 which needed a new engine among other work, but they have retained a 17 year old GM3 which has clocked up some 3300 hours because, having spent

a lot of money on it a season or two ago, it was considered worth retaining. No pedestrian mowing is undertaken and greens are cut

The groomers were removed from the GM3 and 3000 as they were found to "ripple" the perimeter cut, and Ron will not have them on the new machine. The club has verti-cutters for the GM3. The change to diesel power was an important factor in upgrading - a petrol engined 3200 is available, however transporting and storing petrol is proving to be an ever increasing difficulty, whereas there is already a diesel tank in the yard. The clubs, through David Shore, the Course Liaison Manager, are endeavouring to change into a rolling replacement programme.

Lloyd Paladin 21s at Dyrham **Park Country Club, Barnet**

Don Wilson, Course Manager, declares himself to be a dedicated pedestrian man, giving in part the justification that the course is built on heavy London clay - with some variety in the greens which he mole ploughs each year. His other reasoning was that pedestrian mowing gave a better and faster green and a more attractive finish with no edge marking and this was something the members required. The club selected Paladins for several reasons not least of which was the fact that Lloyds at Letchworth were very close to hand for parts and service. However the principle reason was that Don considers that the mower produces a better finish than the other machines which he has tried. The build quality and engineering also received praise.

The club has three of the machines, all of the same age, which are individually numbered. It also has two Jacobsen triples which lack of time and money dictate be used at weekends during peak season - One of the Greenskings is used for verti-cutting. Don does not believe in groomers - or rakes.

There have been no problems with the machines, service is simple and grease points are excellent and readily accessible, nor does the machine shed its grease on the greens.

All three machines go back to Lloyds for a winter overhaul and sharpen, with back lapping being undertaken at Dyrham as necessary, normally two or three times a season. Don said the machines stay on cut well, and seldom need adjusting although this is checked each time they go out. Adjusting the cut is simple, but it does need a box spanner - "this need for a spanner", Don said, "ensures that adjustment is not undertaken by the operator without due consideration." Cutting even in the wet is not a problem.

The club has eight greenkeepers when at full strength, machines are not specific to any greenkeepers and all handles are set at the same height. Transport wheels are not used as normally each greenkeeper has a Cushman which he uses to move himself and the mower from green to green. Don said that he particularly liked the Honda engine, advantages he cited were its reliability, quietness and economy,

and on top of this was the ecofriendly use of unleaded fuel. It has an oil alert switch which ensures that it cannot be run without oil.

Replacement is scheduled for after the machines have done four seasons of work, but prior to that Don is also hoping to buy two more similar machines for his

Huxley 358 Greensmowers at Barton-on-Sea Golf Club, Hampshire

Barton on Sea is a private 27 hole links type course which while long established has recently had to move further away from the sea. Greens are built to full USGA specification. The club bought the second production machine from Huxleys in 1988 and this is still with them, but now down graded to a tees machine. Since then they have bought a further two machines, respectively for the '91 and '93 seasons and it now anticipates replacing the oldest machine next year as part of a five year replacement plan.

Course Manager is Tony Gadd and he said he and all the greenkeeping staff are extremely happy with the Huxleys. The fact that Huxleys are only an hour away and provide an extremely efficient back-up service adds to the fact that the machines are British and priced "right". All machines have combs but not roller brushes.


Tony admitted that the oldest machine has had its troubles and that it is coming to the end of its economic life, but one of the advantages of Huxleys being a small British firm was that they took trouble to listen to the greenkeeper (and Barton greenkeepers in particular) and then acted on this. This has meant that many of the early niggles and problems have been corrected in

the latest models.

A feature of the machine is its good clearance, but Tony reckoned that early machines had sacrificed clean collection as in wet conditions the rollers collected and clumped clippings. Having learnt this Huxleys have made slight design changes to the boxes so that new machines collect 100% of the clippings.

Other features which were noted were the ease of working on the machines and the ease of adjusting the machine. Quality of cut was equal to any in Tony's assessment. Reliability, overall, has been excellent. The machines have all wheels driven and this is considered an essential requirement, probably because the machine is heavier than some and has more weight over the back wheel. Stability on the current model is good but the earlier machine was prone to tip. The latest model also has strengthened cutting unit lift arms to cure the problem of earlier breakage's, but Tony said one of the most significant advances is the improved hydraulic pump capacity which gives a much smoother drive.

Several different operators drive the machines but most of the greens mowing is done by the two first assistants, all are pleased with the machines. Tony said all his staff are consulted before the club buys a new machine. He commented that where anyone has preferred another model of greens mower they have accepted that their preference was not sufficiently strong to warrant a change, especially when it meant loss of commonality of parts and a difference in the location of important controls such as lift/lower.

Dennis FT610 at Fawley Parish Council

Peter Stevens, Head Groundsman at Fawley Parish Council in Hampshire, admitted to being a "new boy" when it came to green-

keeping as the parish has only recently built its own 9 hole course on reclaimed land. His requirement was for a versatile and inexpensive mower for the greens which are relatively small, and this led to selection to the Dennis for its cassette reel change. Compaction is a major problem on the site as is lack of capital and these criteria exclude the purchase of a ride-on triple unit

The course is to be opened next spring and one of Peter's worries is that the maintenance requirement is higher than existing staff and machines will be able to cope with, thus he has retained some reservations.

Nervertheless the Dennis has been used for the past season without any problems and it has done an exceptionally good job. In addition to the cutting unit the council has a verti-cut cassette, and Peter said he likes the look of the sorrel roller unit.

Prompted for design faults, Peter did say that the box could usefully have a handle at the front, but otherwise he had no criticism of the machine.

Servicing is simple and reliability has been total. The machine negotiates the undulations in several greens without trace of



scalping despite the fact that it has a relatively long wheelbase. Supply was by Jenman Engineering of Durley.

John Deere 2243 at Broadway Golf Club

When Broadway needed a new greensmower, service and parts back-up were high on the list of priorities. Cedric Gough, course manager, said that he was not prepared to buy an untried machine nor one where the parts back-up was not 100%. Nor did he expect to be charged for overnight delivery for items which should be in stock.

Other reasons for the selection was the fact that the reels are offset and Cedric was impressed with the units, furthermore the machine is not complex or over endowed with electronics. This latter feature was important because the club has its own greenkeeper/mechanic undertakes most of the clubs work. The new JD 2243 is the recently introduced diesel engined model, and Cedric commented that diesel engines were synonymous with reliability.

Cedric has been to Langar in Nottinghamshire, John Deere's UK depot, and been particularly impressed with the way they operate, getting parts from where ever in the world they are and getting them in fast. He was impressed by the computer net which located parts, and he praised the way that JD record faults and can provide the mechanic with the number of

previous similar faults which have occurred and what the best solution to them is.

Jacobsen Greensking 5 at Enmore Park GC, Somerset

Enmore Park's GK5 has yet to be delivered, the 18 hole private course is committed to Jacobsen for several reasons, firstly they believe in the product and are used to it, having had several previous models, and, secondly and perhaps no less important, they reckon they get superb service from dealer B.S. Mowers of Bristol.

Gary Cook who is head greenkeeper at Enmore Park said that these reasons were important, because "(while) there may be others mowers and dealers, which are as good, there is everything to be said for the devil you know."

In fact most of Gary's knowledge of the new machine is hearsay, but he commented that the GK4 has proved itself and the GK5 is basically similar with added improvements. Of course the new machine will be diesel powered.

NATIONAL SURVEY OF

by Dr S W Baker, Senior Research Officer STRI

ost of the research work that is carried out on golf course construction and agronomy is based on replicated experimental plots, for example on the trials grounds at the Sports Turf Research Institute. This gives the necessary controlled conditions so that the effects of different treatments, e.g. grass type, fertiliser rate or pesticide application can be studied in conditions where all other aspects of construction and maintenance are held constant. For instance, in a construction trial the rootzones may vary but all plots on the trial area will be sown with the same seeds mixture, receive the same amount of fertiliser, top dressing and aeration and all plots will be subjected to artificial wear at the same times.

This careful scientific approach is essential if we are to understand in detail the response of turfgrasses to different forms of management and to make meaningful comparisons between dif-

ferent products so that the best possible advice can be passed on to golf clubs. However there is also a need to monitor what is actually happening on golf courses as this allows a wider range of environmental conditions to be considered, it can provide some additional information on interactions between different management procedures and it also gives information of long term development of golf greens by selecting greens that have been established for many years.

Monitoring of the performance of a large number of golf greens also gives an indication of any commonly occurring problems that should be addressed by additional research work.

In 1993 the Royal and Ancient Golf Club of St Andrews agreed to finance a national survey of golf greens. Many of the objectives of the monitoring work are listed above but there was a particular need to identify performance requirements for golf greens, especially for playing quality. The need to examine performance requirements has been brought about in part by work by the European Committee for Standardisation (CEN) which is developing standards for sports surfaces, including golf greens. However from a research point of view it is also essential to develop a range of measurement techniques to characterise the performance of a golf green and to identify ranges of values that provide an acceptable compromise between the needs of the golfer and the

needs of the greenkeeper. This gives objective methods for assessing all future trials on golf green management.

The measurements of playing quality and development of performance standards will be discussed in a later issue of Greenkeeper International, but in this article I wish to consider some of the findings particularly with respect to soils, grasses and management.

THE SURVEY

Over a seventeen month period between June 1993 and October 1994 my colleagues Tim Lodge, Phil Hind, Jonathan Hunt, Daniel Binns and I visited 74 golf clubs around the country. To minimise travel costs there was an inevitable concentration northern and central England but the overall geographical coverage was from south-west England to the north of Scotland (Figure 1). We tried to select different types of course roughly in proportion to their numbers in the country as a whole. As a result 55% of the

courses visited were classified as parkland, 14% as meadowland, 11% as golf links with smaller numbers of moorland, upland, heathland and seaside courses. At each course testing took place on two greens selected by the greenkeeping staff as being one of their best and one of their poorest greens. This gave a total of 148 greens with a variety of construction types and ranging in age from six months to over 120

Our measurements were varied including soil physical and chemical properties, grass cover, species composition, thatch depth and playing characteristics (green speed, hardness and the stopping distance of balls fired at the turf simulating five iron and nine iron shots. At each course the greenkeeper kindly filled in a detailed maintenance questionnaire and questionnaires were also filled in by players so we could get an impression of the performance of each green.

The main results and principal findings are given below.

SOIL: PHYSICAL PROPERTIES

We did not specifically choose courses where the greens had modern sand dominated rootzones (although some were included in the study), so the greens were developed on a number of soil types. For the lower 100-180mm depth, 47% of the greens had a sand or loamy sand textured soil, 35% were on sandy loam soil and 18% on heavy sandy clay loam or clay loam soils. Rootzone amendment and




Fig. 2: Number of greens with water infiltration values within specific ranges

top dressing with sandy materials meant that the surface layer (10-90mm) was generally lighter, with 65% of greens having a sand or loamy sand texture and only 6% occurring in the sandy clay loam and clay loam categories. Inevitably the highest sand contents were found on the links and heathland courses, along with newer courses where sand dominated rootzones had been used.

Drainage rates were measured by ponding water in two concentric rings and measuring the rate at which water entered the green's surface. The range of infiltration rate values for all the greens summarised in Figure 2 and some important points are evident. The highest value of 171mm/hr was recorded on a long established heathland course and in general the questionnaire completed by greenkeepers indicated that drainage problems were minimal on those greens with 285% sand in the rootzone but increased as the texture became heavier.

Infiltration rates also decreased with the age of the green and averaged a very respectable 22mm/hr for greens up to five years old but fell to an average of 10mm/hr on greens greater than ten years old. This is likely to be a function of increased compaction and greater blockage of the pore space by organic matter, but changes in construction practices over time could also be important as many of the newer greens have been built with specially prepared rootzone mixes.

Rainfall intensities of over 20mm/hr for anything but a few minutes are very rare but ideally infiltration rate values should be >20mm/hr if the green is to cope with very high intensities of rain, for example during a summer thunderstorm. However a minimum drainage rate of 10mm/hr is a more realistic target for most golf greens and provided that they do not have major hollows

that hold water, any surface ponding will normally be short lived. In the study 43% of greens had inflltration rates c10mm/hr and almost one third had values less than 5mm/hr. This situation is far from ideal. It must be remembered however that half of the greens were deliberately selected as being amongst the worst on the course and poor drainage would have been one of the factors influencing greenkeepers' nominations of greens to study. Indeed infiltration rates were significantly higher on those greens classifled as "good" by the greenkeeper, averaging 14mm/hr compared to 8mm/hr on greens classified as "poor".

The other noteworthy physical characteristic is the air-filled porosity. In the laboratory we measured air-filled porosity at two levels of suction: values measured at a water potential of -4kPa are probably the most useful as this gives an indication of the amount of soil air present through much of the winter period. Using measurements from all the greens in the study, the air-filled porosity of the 10-90mm depth averaged 6.6% and the corresponding figure for the 100-180mm depth was 6.9%. This is below the figure of 10% air-filled pore space which is sometimes quoted as being a desirable minimum value. Indeed 41% of greens had values <5%. Again it must be remembered that the sample of greens was not fully representative as greenkeepers deliberately selected half the greens as being poorer ones from their course, nevertheless when taken in conjunction with the infiltration figures it does suggest that many greens have far from desirable soil physical characteris-

SOIL: CHEMICAL PROPERTIES

Greenkeepers were asked to fill in a questionnaire on maintenance and this included information of the fertiliser that they had put on in the preceding twelve months. Most greens received between 75-225 kg/ha of nitrogen, which would seem satisfactory in view of the range of soils at different sites. There were however some cases where we calculated the rate to be over 300 kg/ha which is certainly on the high side even for a sand based green. No phosphate was added on 61% of greens and on 56% of greens no more than 40 kg/ha of potassium (as K₂O) was applied. Phosphate levels




Fig. 3: Species composition of the greens examined, showing the number of greens with measured amounts of annual meadow grass (Poa annua), bent (Agrostis) and fescue (Festuca)

were very variable and there was no relationship between the amount of phosphate applied and measured values in the soil. This almost certainly reflects unnecessarily high levels of phosphate nutrition in the past and the lack of mobility of this element in the soil. In spite of the fact that no phosphate was applied on 61% of the greens, over half the greens had P_2O_2 levels >30 mg/l.

There was a significant, albeit relatively weak, relationship between the amount of potassium applied and levels recorded in the soil. For the main rooting depth (10-90mm) almost one third of the greens had potassium levels classified as very low and for the 100-180mm depth half the greens had nutrient levels falling into this category.

Potassium is relatively mobile within the soil and normally between 60-150 kg/ha of K₂O should be added on an annual basis, depending mainly on the texture of the rootzone. In the light of the flgures that were recorded it would appear that potassium is being under applied on a fairly high percentage of greens.


GRASSES

Averaged over the 148 greens in the study, annual meadow-grass was by far the dominant grass type with three quarters of greens having an annual meadow-grass content exceeding 50% (Figure 3). Bent was the most common of the desirable grass species but fescue was recorded on less than half the greens in the study, with the highest fescue contents being found on relatively new greens less than five years old and on links courses. There were significant relationships between species composition of the greens and the soil physical properties, for examannual meadow-grass increased as the clay content and moisture retention of the green became higher. Fescues on the other hand were more common where sand content was greater and where higher levels of airfllled pore space were recorded.

SOME CLOSING THOUGHTS

The survey has highlighted the fact that greens developed on all but the sandiest of natural soils will not have the soil physical properties generally thought necessary for ideal conditions of Heavier soils are growth. inevitably more water retentive and this tends to give poorer growing conditions which, along with a variety of other factors, will encourage annual meadowgrass invasion into the sward. It is a credit therefore to the greenkeeping staff at the courses visited that they generally managed to produce excellent putting surfaces in spite of the unfavourable soil conditions that many were having to work with.







Managing workplace stress

We all use the term stress in our daily conversations and we all know what we mean by it since we recognise the signs and symptoms in ourselves and others. A common definition sees stress as a physiological response to undue pressure brought about when there appears to be a gap between how a person perceives the demands being made on them and how they view their ability to

With the increased demands being made upon managers and their employees to achieve more with fewer resources at a time of unprecedented change, stress is on the increase and greenkeeping is not immune for these pressures.

The prospect of increased civil liablilty claims for stress has been raised following the much publicised case of John Walker verses Northumberland County Council in 1994. This test case set a new legal precedent under which employers may in future be liable under the Health and Safety at Work legislation if employees can prove that they suffered work related illness due to undue occupational stress.

Apart from the prospect of costly litigation, why do employers and management need to take stress management seriously?

The reasons are clear: If occupational stress builds up to unacceptable levels, then employee welfare and productivity will suffer. Surveys undertaken by the HSE and others suggest that the problem is now seen as a major contributor to work-related illness

Brin will be conducting a free session on supervisory management during BTME 96, in the Royal Hall on Thursday January 25 from 1-1.40pm. There's no need to book - just turn up on the day

and sickness absence. Up to 40% of sickness absences may be stress related.

Dr Vernon Coleman estimates that for every employee on the payroll, stress costs about £1,000 per year in lost time due to stress related illness. Stress costs British Industry something like £20 billion a year, making Britain a world leader in the damage that stress does.

How do we account for these trends? Professor Tom Cox suggests that workplace stress is an organisational issue and that employers and managers should consider whether work design and management which result in excessive and unreasonable pressures are posing a risk to health.

The signs of workplace stress can be observed in reduction in output, higher wastage and error rates, weaher planning and control of work, poor motivation and commitment, erratic or poor timekeeping, poor customer service and conflict and tension between colleagues.

Effective stress management can't just cure the symptoms, it has to look at the cause. Change and uncertainty, lack of clear objectives and inflexible and overdemanding schedules all contribute to occupational stress.

What should our response be? The first step must be to raise awareness of stress as a serious health and safety issue and ensure that practical steps are taken in relation to the day to day planning and organisation of work. We need to raise awareness first because it is something that people are reluctant to discuss. We need to get across the message that it is not wimpish to admit to experiencing stress. Stress is not down to individual susceptibility or weakness.

Finally, we need to invest in management training to prepare Course Managers and Head Greenkeepers for this additional responsibility.



NATIONAL EDUCATION **CONFERENCE SPEAKERS**

How do the various climatic conditions affect grass growth on golf courses in the United States is the very topical subject presented by Stan Zontek, Director of the USGA Green Section Mid Atlantic Region. Stan is an experienced speaker who has visited us and spoken at previous BIGGA events. With unusual weather conditions becoming the norm in the UK, this talk should show how US superintendents cope with the often difficult weather conditions over there.

In a slight change from the usual type of talk, lan McMillan, Course Manager at Hankley Common Golf Club gives his practical ideas on the Selection of Grass Species for golf courses while Dr Andy Newall. from the STRI gives the academic viewpoint. Peter Jones continues with his practical approach to Integrated Pest Management, with Dr Kate York, from the STRI giving the academic view.

Want to learn how pesticides are developed and produced and perhaps why fine turf products cost more than agricultural products then Jonathan Hill, from Rhône Poulenc may be able to give you the answers. Jonathan, Rhône Poulenc's Market Development Manager is a graduate, in Pure and Applied Biology, at Oxford. He joined Rhône Poulenc in 1991 as a Research Officer, testing herbicides. He moved to the Environmental Products Department in 1994 and became Market Development Manager, with a strong emphasis on new product developments.

Peter Wisbey is no stranger to Harrogate and, as Technical Director at the Sociedade Do Golf Da

Quinta Do Largo, he is well versed in warm weather grasses and the problems of providing irrigation. Indeed, Peter's Algarvian Experience has been for him and could be for you, a true Learning Experience.

David Whitaker, one of BIGGA's Master Greenkeepers has been at the Wisley Golf Club for five years. As Course Manager, David has had to control and monitor the course maintenance budget and so is well qualified to present his ideas on how a budget should be managed. As more clubs become cost conscious then budget management becomes more important for greenkeepers.

Neville Pearson, who has been responsible for several golf course developments in Lancashire. Cheshire and the West Midlands, has worked for ADAS in the North West since 1979. Recent projects include the redesign and construction of a municipal course, the design and project management of new holes for a private club and the development of new courses from farmland.

The weather is a key part of Trevor Smith's talk. Trevor is the Past President of the Canadian Golf Course Superintendents Association and he will be talking about the effects of the harsh Canadian winters on their golf courses.

Alan Gange and David Garthwaite have been conducting research into the use of pesticides on golf courses. Alan, from London University will dicuss some ideas on golf course ecology, including the mycorrhizal relationship of poa, festuca and agrostis species. David, from the Central Science Laboratory will present the preliminary results of the 1994 golf course survey, including, response rates, estimated annual usage, reasons for use and comparisons with other agricultural and horticul-

John Wells has been a greenkeeper for 20 years, starting his career at Welwyn Garden City. Now at Brocket Hall Golf Club, John has recently qualified as a Master Greenkeeper and will be awarded his certificate at Harrogate. John will talk about the change from soil based to sand based greens, concentrating on the different management techniques required for each.

David Winterton is the second newly qualified Master Greenkeeper to speak at this year's conference. David, who is the Course Manager at Donnington Grove Golf Course, feels that his staff are the most important resource that he has and his talk explains this belief.

How to cope with managing a golf course up a mountain, given the problems of snow and diseases and how to rebuild 18 greens in five months are the subject of lan Tomlinson's talk. Ian, the Course Manager at Lausanne Golf Club in Switzerland is not only a member of BIGGA but is also the Vice President of the Swiss Greenkeepers Association.

The National Education Conference is rounded off by a keynote speech from Dr Joe M Vargas jnr. Recently described by Jim Arthur as a "Masterpiece", Joe is Professor of Botany and Plant Pathology at Michigan State University. Joe will compare creeping bentgrass and annual meadow grass to illustrate which is stronger, commenting on cultural practices, pest management and folk lore.

EDUCATIONAL SEMINAR SPEAKERS

Wednesday morning sees the start of the BTME seminar programme. Session A is presented by the Institution of Agricultural Engineers and includes Mark Gunter, from the Toro company, speaking on the Technology used in Managing Irrigation Systems, Tim Lodge from the STRI, speaking on Irrigation Need in relation to Green Design and Maggie Pratt from the National Rivers Authority Water Resource Implications for Golf Course Design. With irrigation systems sometimes seen as an unnecessary extravagance, 1995 has illustrated the folly of such thinking. It is important to deploy the best available technology to make the best use of available resources. Come to this seminar and discover what it is.

Trevor Smith, Past President of the Canadian Golf Course Superintendents Association returns to starts off the afternoon session with a talk on the CGSA and how it fits into the game of golf in Canada,

Two more of BIGGA's prize winners appear next. David Walden, Zeneca Premier Greenkeeper of 1994, has been in greenkeeping since 1973 and now works as Golf Course superintendent for Nene Valley Golf Services in Peterborough. David has recently completed his HNC, by distance learning, is qualified as a D32 and D36 assessor and is working towards D33. David will relate his experiences in winning the Premier Greenkeeper of the Year Competition and what difference winning has made to his career.


Euan Grant was the TORO/PGA European Tour Student of the Year 1994. He has recently moved from the Effingham Golf Club in Surrey

to the Royal Jersey Club, so his title 'Back Down to Earth' may be somewhat misleading. Euan graduated from Leeds University with an honours degree in Sport and Leisure Management but decided that greenkeeping was for him. His choice of career was obviously the correct one judging from his progress so far. Euan will talk about his experiences leading up to, during and after the Student of the Year Competition.

New to Harrogate as speakers are representatives from three of the four Home Golf Unions. First, Neil Hayward from the English Golf Union will discuss the Role of the Unions Today. Neil joined the EGU in 1991 and is employed as the Golf Development Course Secretary. His work includes administration on behalf of the Golf Course Committee and he has been responsible for organising a series of workshops for golf club officials. The second speaker in this seminar is Joe Furlong, from the Golfing Union of Ireland. Joe retired in 1992, after spending 46 years with the Dublin Port Authority. His involvement with golf began in 1968 when he joined the Royal Tara Golf Club and he has been involved with the GUI since 1975. Joe is well qualified to talk on the **Evolution of Greenkeeper Training** in Ireland and will discuss how training has changed and will continue to change. The final golf union speaker is Bob McLaren from the Scottish Golf Union. Bob has played golf since he was ten years old, has been President of the Scottish Golf Union and is, currently. Chairman of the Greenkeepers Training Committee. Bob has seen many changes in the game of golf and with a 'foot in both camps', he is ideally suited to look at the relationship between greenkeepers, golf clubs and SGU.

Last year's severe drought illustrated all too well, the need to monitor wisely the use of water for irrigation. Peter White, runs a water monitoring business in the UK, Portugal and Spain. He measures what is actually happening in the soil, so taking the guess work out of irrigation. Peter will illustrate what can happen, what can be done about it and how things might change in the future.

Lorraine Hatton, from Plan It Training and Consultancy, ably assisted by Sue Gudgeon from the GTC, will be looking at the training of greenkeepers. They will aim to show that training is not something just to be completed at the start of a career but should be continued throughout working life. Lorraine is well known to many greenkeepers who have been working towards an assessor award and Sue has been involved with BIGGA, the GTC and assessor training.

If you can't see the wood for the trees then Andrew Boyd from Bridlington Golf Club may be able to help. Andrew has been involved with greenkeeping since he was 16 and now manages Bridlington's oldest established golf course. Andrew's talk covers the progress of a tree planting programme at Bridlington, what grants were available, the added value that trees give to his course and he also looks to the future.

How do you put evidence together for presentation to an assessor? What is a portfolio? These are just two of the questions that will be answered during Brin Bendon's talk on Portfolio Development. Brin is well known to delegates on **BIGGA Supervisory Management** Courses, which he has presented for two years at Aldwark Manor.

Brin, a training consultant with Vector Training, is a very experienced trainer, both indoors and outdoors. An enthusiastic hill walker and climber, Brin runs management courses 'out in the hills' as well as in the classroom. Brin will be the tutor on several of the Regional Supervisory Management Courses commencing in February.

Jenny Rolf lectures in psychology at the College of St Mark and St John, which is affiliated to Exeter University. Jenny seems to manage her stress by gardening, interior decorating and walking the hills and coastline of Devon. In her talk, Jenny will attempt to define stress, show you how to recognise it, cope with it and manage your staff so as to reduce it.

Back across the pond for our next speaker, Gary T Grigg, President of the Golf Course Superintendents Association of America. Gary who is the Superintendent at the Royal Poinciana Golf Club in Naples Florida has been a member of the GCSAA for 24 years and has served on its board for six years. Gary holds Masters Degrees in entomology and agronomy and a bachelors degree in agriculture. Gary's talk will show how the role the superintendent has expanded through the years and how the GCSAA has developed to meet that change in role, which should be familiar territory to BIGGA members.

Ron Coleman is the Managing Director of Lubrication Engineers in the United Kingdom. He has 30 years experience in the field of lubricants and is therefore well qualified to deliver a talk on how improved lubrication practices can assist in improving efficiency and reduce operating costs.

Stan Zontek's second speech of the week looks at New Trends in Turfgrass Management in the US. Stan, who is the Director of the Greens Section Mid Atlantic Region of the USGA. This time, Stan looks at long and short term trends in turfgrass management including Integrated Pest Management and Best Management Techniques and the trend to make many US golf courses more 'natural' like many in Britain.

Improve your golf course but don't spend too much seems to be the theme of John Armitage's talk. John, who is a member of the R&A, chairman of green at Littlestone Golf Course and a director of Green Eagle Golf, who design and build golf courses, seems to have found six techniques which are easy to implement at little cost yet improve the course dramatically.

Our final seminar of 1996 reintroduces Dr Joe Vargas. Joe, who is also speaking at the National Education Conference, is Professor of Botany and Plant Pathology at Michigan State University and a well known and respected author. Joe's talk is about Integrated Pest Management and its role in turfgrass management, covering cultural, biological, genetic and chemical pest management as well control methods designed to reduce pesticide use.

t must be something in the Cheshire air," said 1995 Miracle Professional Greenkeeper of the Year Mike Goodhind by way of an explanation as to why there are now two Greenkeepers of the Year working within two miles of each other.

Mike, Course Manager at the Tytherington Club in Macclesfield, is in constant touch with Anthony Davies, the inaugural winner of the award who is Course Manager at the neighbouring Prestbury Golf Club.

"We talk on a weekly basis and I think it was Anthony who put my name forward for the award. I was also able to quiz him on the type of questions to expect in the final," said Mike. Anthony, who won the title in 1990, kept up his tradition of always leaving a message of congratulations and good luck to all the finalists on the BIGGA Headquarters answer machine on the morning of the final.

Mike's victory came against a high quality, and evenly matched set of finalists and he just edged Chris Brook of Chesfield Downs, Stevenage, into second place and Don Wilson of Dyrham Park, Barnet into third. Joint runners-up



were Ed McCabe of Brockenhurst Manor, Hampshire and James Devlin of Troon Golf Courses, Ayrshire

Mike's victory in the award is all the more meritorious when it is considered that he triumphed in a year when we have had the worst drought since 1976 with sand greens and no automatic watering system.

"It's a credit to my staff, particularly my assistant Mike Stewart, who handled the course visit at the regional stage while I was sunning myself in Minorca. They get a cheque for £500 to share from Miracle Professional and they will appreciate it. It was very much a team effort and they are adaptable and always come back if there is work to be done.

"I'm also delighted for my wife, Karen, who had to put up with me working all hours in the summer. For a two month spell I was in at five o'clock most mornings and back in again at nine in the evening to do another stint seven days a week."

The Tytherington Club is in the new vein of country club courses, 18 holes with all the related leisure facilities. It is also the home of the Women Professional Golfers European Tour and played host to the Ladies' English Open.

A year ago there was also a change of ownership which brought Mike into contact if John Millen, BIGGA's 1994 Chairman, who was Director of Greenkeeping for the new owners, Club

"John has gone a long way to influencing my career," explained Mike, before adding that it was a little difficult for them both when John first arrived.

"I had been there for 12 months when the club was sold and it was a real shock. John was brought in and he was also a Head Greenkeeper and neither of us knew what to expect. It was an awkward situation but in time we have both begun to appreciate the qualities in each other.

"He is now spending more time at the company's other course in Lambourne but I generally see him one day a week and he's very good at backing me up and making sure I have the resources to do the job," said Mike (35).

It is within the last year that Mike has really seen his career take off.

"I'm very thankful to Club Partners for their investment in me over the last 12 months and in that time I've really seen the benefits of the way they work. I feel that personally I've developed quite considerably over that period and more than anything else it's because I've been pushed.

"We go in for the Investors in People Award at the club and the key to that is the involvement with every employee and the role everyone plays within the organisation and we've tried to develop that within the greens staff."



which Mike has developed and the high degree of record keeping which he feels went a long way to getting him the award.

"The management want accountability so they are making me learn new skills on the management side.

The club has a central administration department which comes up with a format for all the record keeping which is used throughout the club.

"We can account for every hour which is spent on the golf course. At first that's a little frightening - a bit like a time and motion study but it's not like that at all. There are a lot of benefits. For example this year I argued to get a new bunker raker but the club wasn't too keen. Through running the budget management we came up with a labour cost of 1114 hours of bunker raking by hand and that it accounted for 20% of our time. Once they heard that they realised the importance of it and we got our new bunker raker.

"Initially I felt that the time filling in forms would be better spent out on the course. I was a hands on person, 'let's get out there' lead by example type but I've come to appreciate the benefits of good management.

"We have a weekly staff meeting which is very open and if it's felt I'm not doing something right they tell me. That goes right through the club, everyone is on first name terms, even the Managing Director, and it's a lovely atmosphere to work in.

"We're all cogs in a wheel and there is no 'them and us' attitude which a lot of greenkeepers at big clubs suffer from."

If Mike's handicap had continued to fall he might have been rivalling Colin Montgomerie for the Golfer of the Year and not the Greenkeeper of the Year

"I started off at Macclesfield Golf Club but I was initially more concerned with trying to develop my golf game as it was my ambition to make it as a professional but it was not to be.

"I did get the opportunity to work on the course and I got more into the greenkeeping side and my golf fell away."

From Macclesfield Mike went

as a trainee to Prestbury rising to First Assistant and worked under one of the old school of greenkeepers John Leonard. "From a practical side I couldn't have had a better tutor.'

"I left there at 21 and went to Heaton Moors in Manchester as Head Greenkeeper. It was an ideal place to go because it was a step up for me and a place where I could learn from my mistakes."

In 1984 Mike went to Cavendish Golf Club in Buxton Derbyshire as Course Manager where he spent nine extremely enjoyable years.

"It was a very high golf course and the first winter I was there I didn't see a blade of grass from the first week in January to the last week in February."

That brought in the course's other use, that of ski centre.

"We had three ski tows on the course and had a run known as the Cresta Run which is world famous in that part of Derbyshire. It ran over three fairways and finished in a stream. I developed my skiing skills while at Cavendish and it was a super club to work for, extremely friendly.

"It was a real wrench to leave and I had to give it a great deal of thought. I'd built new sheds, new workshop and all the lads had uniforms. I'd built it all up and I could take pride in what we'd achieved. Everyone knew what they were doing and it almost took care of itself so really if you feel like that it's time for a new challenge."

The Tytherington Club was back in Macclesfield and Mike could see how the club was developing with the WPGET and professional Tour events.

"A major influence was the fact that it held major events and it was another step up the ladder."

The Ladies' English Open was

held on the course last year and it was another big step for Mike.

"It was a real eye opener with the television cameras there and the overall attention to detail. Fortunately I was given quite a bit of warning about what the Tour wanted and had quite a bit of input myself."

The club has an excellent internal training programme and Mike has already completed his D32 and D33.

"One thing which does appeal to me is the HNC course at Reaseheath College and if the club agrees I'd like to do it because it can be done on a distance learning basis...

"The way the industry is going nobody can lie still. The number of students taking the HND courses mean that all it needs is for them to get a bit of practical experience and I feel in ten year's time, probably less, they will be landing some pretty good jobs. You need the ability to think ahead and keep developing."

It is that sort of attitude which encouraged the judges Pat Murphy and Richard Minton who also visited the finalists courses, Roger Mossop and Neil Thomas to award him the prize.

"It is a prestigious award and I'm very proud for Karen and our four children Leah (7), Holly (6), Grace (3) and Callum (2)," said Mike, whose other claim to sporting fame is that he holds the record for the Cheshire Cricket League with the high score of 177 not out in a limited 40 overs game for Bollington.

"As for the future I've got work to do at Tytherington. It's still got a long way to go to fulfil its great potential and I want to be a part of that."


Roger Mossop, Business Manager for Miracle Professional, praised each of the five finalists and said that they were the closest matched in the history of the

"Mike's course was excellent and his level or management and record keeping was second to none," said Roger as he made the presentation. 

A refund from the VAT man meant that many clubs in the country were awash with funds. Wolstanton was one which put the money to good use. Scott MacCallum reports.

The news was greeted with an amazement not dulled by the falling of the Berlin Wall, the dismantling of apartheid or England reaching the semi finals of the 1990 World Cup finals all extraordinary events from around the same time.

"Never in a month of Sundays...", "I'll eat my hat...", "Hell'll freeze over before it happens..." were just some of the incredulous remarks coming out of golf clubs when rumours reached them that the VAT man might just be handing back money after an EC directive.

Well I'm sure we've had a month's worth of Sabbaths since the rumours began and that milliners have done a roaring trade in smoky bacon flavoured boaters. I can't, however, vouch for the climatic conditions in Old Nick's back yard but all the same it was true and golf clubs, at least members' golf clubs, have been given a wonderful windfall.

The reason it happened is irrelevant to the clubs which are basking in new found riches but came about because as members' clubs they were entitled to VAT exemption on membership fees but had been paying it since 1990.

Anyone who comes into large sums of money has problems – or so I'm told. Bev Nicholson, that bloke who won £19 million on the lottery, Paul Gascoigne have all proved that money brought difficulties and golf clubs were no exception.

Who did it belong to? Or, to be grammatically correct, To whom did it belong? Was it the club's or was it due to the individual members who had paid the VAT on the membership subscriptions in the first place?

The best legal minds in the country were divided and it was left to clubs themselves to decide how best to cope with the best problem they had encountered in many years.

One club which was one of the earliest to reach a decision which was acceptable to everyone was Wolstanton GC in Newcastle-under-Lyme where the person with most to be pleased about was Course Manager, Bob Lupton, who has been able to improve the conditions of his staff and solve a long term drainage problem.

"It was always accepted by the club that the facilities for the greenkeeping staff were not very good from either a welfare point

of view and from the health and safety aspect," explained Bob.

"We basically had a dilapidated 50 year-old ex-Ministry of Defence building and while we had a flushing toilet, hot and cold running water and central heating we didn't have any showers and the general condition of the building left a lot to be desired."

It had always been intended that the facilities would be improved but that it would be as and when the money was raised by the club and Bob was told when he was appointed two and a half years ago that it was going to be done.

When it was discovered that money was due from the VAT man and the amount the club's directors sat down and wondered what was the best way to handle the windfall in fairness to the members.

Many of the members felt that the money was theirs and that it should be returned to them but there was a view that the club, as the receiving body, was entitled to it

"We were in a very fortunate situation as we had all the individual records of members going back to the time in question so if required we could work out how much each individual was entitled to," explained Club Secretary, Mike Staniforth.

It was a task that is more difficult than it would at first appear as the varying membership categories would have paid different amounts, some members were members at the beginning of the qualifying period but not the end and others joined midway through the time and only paid a portion of the recoverable VAT money.

The decision the Board took was a masterpiece and all members should be handed the task of conducting the Irish and Bosnian peace talks as quickly as possible.

It was decided that the money should be refunded to the members and, at the same time, impose a levy on them for the amount of money required to improve the greenkeeping staff's facilities and the drainage work on the course.

"We held an extraordinary general meeting where proposal number one was to reimburse the members to the full extent of the refund and then we had a director who very capably explained the reasoning behind why we need to spend money on the golf course and the second proposal was that we levy the members a certain amount of the money in order to carry out the necessary improvements," explained Mike.

"It was very cleverly done. We had over 200 members out of a membership of over 600 and the proposal was carried with a majority of around 95%."

Amounts vary but a full playing

member who qualified for the full period of the refund received around £80 as well as seeing the improvements to the club.

"The refund and the levy were done in conjunction with last year's subscriptions. Instead of asking for just a subscription without VAT we asked for a subscription, plus the levy, minus the VAT refund. It was an administrative nightmare but is showed everyone exactly what was happening," explained Mike.

The new greenkeeping facilities include a new £30,000 storage facility and a second phase which will be completed soon.

"This will have showers, toilets, drying room, mess room, office, workshop facilities and will cost around £40-£50,000," said Bob. "Had we had to wait until money became available it might have meant a four or five year phased plan and we may not have got as good as we are going to end up with."

"There have been no adverse comments from members at all because our existing building is on the way down to the first tee and they have been aware of our lack of facilities."

The influx of money has also allowed Bob to tackle a long standing drainage problem at the bottom end of the course.

The course borders the A34 with housing between the course and the road and the problems arose because the course sheds down to the A34 but the houses stopped drainage water going down and there was no access.

""We have now been able to gain access to the A43 through one of the houses through which we've installed a proper drainage scheme, but it's cost a lot of money to do this," explained Bob.

"The resident is not a member but we wanted to put a drain down his drive and he is getting a new drive and a patio and various other things out of the deal. All his legal costs have been paid by the club and it's not cost him a penny.

"We're not only solving a problem for the golf club we're also solving a problem for the residents whose homes were being flooded in winter time."

The total cost of the new greenkeeping facilities and the drainage scheme is in the region of £100,000 paid for entirely by the VAT windfall while the members also enjoyed a rebate on their subscriptions.





Miracle Professional Premier Greenkeeper will receive a plaque, will be offered the chance to attend the Golf Course Superintendents Association of America Conference and Show in Las Vegas in February 1997 and will be presented with a cheque for £500 for his greenkeeping team.





The Pythium scare

It must be understood that there is emphatically no recorded incidence of an attack of Pythium blight (caused by the fungi P.aphanidermatum or P.ultimum) in northern temperate Europe, with only isolated suspect cases in the Mediterranean area. This disease which causes serious problems in the very hot, very humid states of the USA is not to be confused with seedling damping-off diseases caused by other Pythium species.

It should be noted that even in the most susceptible areas of the south eastern States in America, it needs long periods of very hot, very humid weather for the disease to strike. When it does it strikes very quickly indeed, giving little chance for curative or corrective treatment.

While it is rash to deny the first appearance of anything, whether it be a rare bird never before seen in Britain or a new disease one must say that pigs are more likely to fly than for a disease suddenly to appear in circumstances vastly different from those pertaining to where it is a real problem.

It is significant that reports of the disease are coming from all over Britain and Ireland – clearly a scare on the lines of BSE in cattle! This would not matter if it were not for the fact that this wrong diagnosis may prevent action being taken against the real cause of the symptoms being reported as Pythium blight and in consequence needless damage is accepted as inevitable.

One can safely say that the fungal disease attacking the Royal Porthcawl greens at the time of the Walker Cup was not Pythium blight. Had it been, there would have been no greens on which to play and the speed of the devastation would have been phenomenal. It has been described as a disease which you can actually see spreading it is so quick. Furthermore, the symptoms seen by many were not those of Pythium blight, this first shows as characteristic spots, before it spreads like wildfire. In the words of the leading American mycologist Professior Vargas:"...if you notice large irregular dead patches without having seen spots first, the problem is not Pythium blight and you must look for a different cause."

The fact that the greens affected were not those where root zones had been changed – these were free – indicates that the problem was a soil-borne disease, and Pythium is air-borme. Stress was probably an aggravating factor rather than a cause.

There are perhaps two centres where accurate identification of the Pythium species can be made and these do not get samples. All those who have spent years looking down microscopes know

when to discount what they see. Charitably, what was seen was a secondary saprophytic growth of mould developed in transit!

If this disease has never been seen in Europe by not only ourselves but all leading golf course agronomists who have discussed this with us, then one can safely say that it is unlikely to attack your greens. In fact we would suggest that there is more probability of someone winning the National Lottery jackpot on four successive weeks!

Finally a word of warning to mycologists working in unfamiliar country! Never diagnose a disease on the basis of what you see under the microscope alone, but look at least at pictures or descriptions of the field symptoms. there are very few serious fungal diseases affecting golf grasses in this country so do not make the mistake of thinking we are going to be invaded from the States or Mars. You will all have seen Pythium but not Pythium blight. The Pythium you see is that growing on a mouldy crust of bread – and that will not kill turf!

We can learn, however, from this scare - and not just to get accurate examinations. Grass in greenkeeping is increasingly under stress, but that situation is best handled by sensible sound greenkeeping, which will protect turf naturally. Cronic "fus", it is always claimed, is a sign of bad greenkeeping, but the mistakes may well have been perpetrated by past greenkeepers, who have bequeathed unhappy legacies by past over-feeding and over-watering. Even so, disasters do have a habit of occurring at the most inconvenient times and sympathy must be extended to the sufferers, the chief of whom is the man on the spot. Nevertheless parallel disasters in the past have been diagnosed accurately, but whether we can learn and prevent their repetition is another matter!

We must also hope that Pythium blight never reaches these shores because although there are effective fungicides in the States, if applied in anticipation, they certainly could not be used here because they have no approval for use on turf.

Pythium facts

Infection begins at about 18°C and foliar blighting develops most rapidly when air temperatures are in the 29-35°C range.

Things to watch out for: Daytime air temperatures of 30° or more, nightime temperatures of 20° or above, combined

with a relative humidity of 90% or higher.

The susceptability of bentgrass to Pythium aphanidermatum increases significantly when grass is being grown at high salinity, outbreaks of Pythium can occur at temperatures and humidities much lower than those thought to be favourable for disease development (Rasmussen and Stanghellini, 1988)

Pythium Zoospores are very small, and move rapidly in free water, and may spread the fungus through a drainage pattern. The pathogen spreads from leaf to leaf by rapid grown of mycelium. Mycelium infected plant tissues move over large areas on equipment and on shoes. Lush dense, growth with high nitrogen fertilisation is especially susceptable to attack, and the disease may become more severe in alkaline soils than in acid soils.

Management practices to reduce the incidence of Pythium include the removal of dew and guttation water. Leaf wetness can also be reduced by two to four hours when the irrigation system is set to begin at least three hours after sunset and completed before sunrise.

Detection is paramount, therefore, consider investing in a microscope so that a diagnosis can be made early. This is achieved by examination of grass leaves for Pythiu hyphae.

Also if your irrigation has an on-site weather station this can aid in monitoring temperatures and humidity.


