## **Greenkeeper Membership**



Following a vote at the Annual General Meeting, held in Harrogate, on January 22, all those wishing to join the Association as Greenkeeper Members, after February 1, 2003, will need a minimum qualification of N/SVQ Level 2 Sportsturf or equivalent qualification. This change to the Constitution will not affect current

members who will retain their current membership category. Anyone wishing to join the Association after February 1, 2003 who does not hold a minimum qualification of N/SVQ Level 2 Sportsturf or equivalent qualification will be offered membership of the Association and will be called Members, i.e. not Greenkeeper Members, until such time as they become

Non-Greenkeeper, Members will pay a reduced membership fee of £10 less than the equivalent Greenkeeper Member rate. This reflects the lower recommended salaries for unqualified personnel. Additionally, Non Greenkeeper Members will not be given voting rights nor will be allowed to take up office at National, Regional or Section level.
