Now Is the Time to

Stop feeding roses.

Dig in the mulch on perennial border.

Feed Peonies for next year's bloom.

Plant that new strawberry bed.

Sow Pansies and Forget-me-nots for next year's bloom.

Stop feeding ever greens about the end of August. Do not use the shears to shape them any time until frost. Don't let them dry out. Evergreens are about the most appreciative of all plants of a dug-in mulch.

Select from the following shrubs accent for borders: Viburnum Carlesi, Flowering Crab, Hawthorne, Euonymus Alatus, Magnolia Stellata or Prunus Triloba.

Cut Strawflowers and Statice for winter bouquets.

Prune the laterals on the Chrysanthemums-They will yield larger and better flowers.

Perennials that will bloom in August: Chimney Bellflower, Artemesia, Liatris, Lilium Speciosum, Veronica, Coreopsis, Euphorbia, Funkia, Daisies, Helianthus, Salvia, Sedum, Tritoma and Hibiscus.
