QUESTION BOX

What is the best chemical and the usual schedule of procedure for the control of snow mold?

Ans. Teresan at 3 to 4 pounds per green applied as late in the fall is possible prior to the first heavy snow.

Question: What percentage of the members present used soluble fertilizer more than once this past year?

Ans.: 50%.

Question: Which aerifying machine is better, the Night Crawler or the F. G. Aerifier?

Ans. No direct recommendation. Each has its own characteristic action and results.

Question: Will Chlordane kill night crawlers?

Ans. Yes. Ten pounds of actual chlordane per acre, or one and one half pounds per 6000 foot green.

Question: What results have been obtained with U3 Bermuda in this part of the country?

Ans. Not recommended at this time. Ray Gerber and Don Strand reported theirs froze out completely. Norm Johnson had some at LaGrange that showed no sign of life till June 15th.

Question: Would it be advisable to stock up on materials now for next year?

Ans. Yes. Fertilizer materials will be short. Steel and rubber supplies will be critical. Tersan will be ample. Seed crop will be short and high.


