## Colonel James B. Irwin Prayer Breakfast Speaker

There are more than five billion people on planet earth. Only twelve of them have walked on the moon. Colonel James B. Irwin is one of them.

As a determined young man, Jim Irwin set his sights high. He graduated from the U.S. Naval Academy and received a Master of Science degree from the University of Michigan. Upon graduation from the Naval Academy, he was commissioned in the Air Force. In 1961



he graduated from the Experimental Test Pilot School and in 1963 from the Aerospace Research Pilot School.

In 1961 Irwin was in a near-fatal airplane crash. But, through sheer determination, the skill of attending physicians and the grace of God, Irwin recovered. In 1966 NASA selected him for the Apollo space program. He was a support crewman on Apollo 10 and back-up crewman on Apollo 12. In the Apollo 15 mission he was the lunar module pilot and became the eighth human being in history to set foot on the moon.

He retired from the Air Force in 1972 and formed High Flight Foundation for the purpose of helping his fellowman aspire to the "high flight of life." He is an author of three motivational books and a popular speaker before business, civic and religious groups.

He holds honorary doctorate degrees from three universities and has been awarded numerous military, community, and service awards.
