## Leaves, Limbs, Needles and Boughs

This months selection is no doubt one of the most over looked evergreens when one goes to choose a planting for the golf course or his home yard. It is one of the noblest forest trees, very ornamental under cultivation and an excellent specimen. This tree is not suited for an underplanting or windbreak and makes one of the best short-needled Christmas trees because the needles do not easily fall off as is the case with "Abies" (fir) and "Picea" (Spruce).
"Pseudotsuga menziesii" (soo-do-soo ga men-ze ze-i) Douglasfir
Needles: Have a V-shaped arrangement between the 2 lateral sets, straight, 1 to $11 / 2$ long, thin, dark green above, with 2 white bands of stomata beneath, smelling of camphor when bruised.

Stem: Yellowish green initially, becoming gray to brown, minutely pubescent or almost glabrous.

Cones: Three to $4^{\prime \prime}$ long, $1^{1 / 2}$ to $2^{\prime \prime}$ wide, light brown in color.
Size: Under landscape conditions will grow 40 to $80^{\prime}$ in height with a 12 to $20^{\prime}$ spread; can grow to $200^{\prime}$ and greater in natural habitat.
Culture: Transplants well, prefers neutral or slightly acid, well drained moist soils, fails on dry, poor soils, prefers sunny open conditions. Injured by high winds. Medium rate of growth, will grow 12 to 15 ' in a 10 year period.
