
Leaves, Limbs, Needles & Boughs

Last month we discussed the English Oak and this month I'll stay on the oaks and bring out the fine points of a seldom used oak, but one that does quite well in our area. Unfortunately very few nurseries grow "Quercus imbricaria" (kwer'kus im-brika'ri-a), commonly known as the Shingle Oak or Laurel Oak.

Leaves: Alternate, simple, $2\frac{1}{2}$ to 6'' long, 1 to 3'' wide, oblong or lanceolate, acute at apex with bristle-like tip. Dark green and glabrous above, pale green or brownish pubescent beneath.



Buds: Imbricate, ovoid, sharp pointed, 1/8" long, brownish, often slightly hairy.

Stem: Slender, green-brown, lustrous, glabrous, angled.



Size: 50 to 60' in height, developing a comparable or slightly greater spread, can grow to 80 to 100' in height.

Habit: Pyramidal to upright-oval in youth, assuming a broadrounded outline in old age, often with drooping lower lateral branches.

Bark: Gray-brown, close, eventually with broad low ridges separated by shallow furrows.

Culture: Transplants with less difficulty than many oaks; prefers moist rich, deep, well-drained, acid soil although is tolerant of drier soils; needs full sun. Does quite well in the midwest and used for lawn, street, park and golf courses. Accepts pruning very well and can be used for hedges; the leaves persist into winter.

Tree Trivia: The American Beech tree has an oil throughout its system that is resistent to electricity. This makes the beech less likely to sustain lightning damage than any other tree.
