Her era saw the mechanization of the golf courses and the first chemicals used to control weeds and disease.

and since the first of the year 60 members have been elected to membership or have been reinstated to active membership. Using this increase as a gauge, by the end of this year membership in the National Association should be stronger than ever before.

At the Friday morning Membership Meeting, the Membership voted to increase the dues to \$10 yearly retroactive January 1, 1937. All membership cards issued for 1937 at the old rate have been declared null and void. The purpose underlying the raise in dues is to increase the scope and value of the organized greenkeeping movement.

At the same meeting, the Membership voted to change the name of the organization to "The American Greenkeepers Society." The change in title will not become effective perhaps until the first of 1938.
