I would like to thank you for your support and confidence in allowing me to serve you as a member of the Board of Directors for the MAGCS. It is a great honor and I pledge to do my best in serving you as chair of this year's Golf Committee.

The Golf Committee met in March and by unanimous vote recommended to the Board that a change was necessary in the way handicaps are handled for our golf events. The committee felt that a change will ensure that all participants will be competing on a level playing field. In the past, each competitor was asked to state his/her handicap. The problem occurred when, in some cases, participants would write in their USGA Index number. Frequently, the index number was then applied as the competitor's handicap. This

created a problem when we would play a course that had a high slope rating (e.g., Bull Valley). In such a situation, the competitor would not receive the correct number of strokes allocated.

With the Board of Directors' approval, and in accordance with the standard operating procedures of the MAGCS Golf Committee, we will implement a change starting with our June meeting at Winnetka Golf Club. All competitors will be required to submit a verifiable USGA Index number in order to be eligible for and qualify for

net division prizes.

With the Board of Directors' approval, and in accordance with the standard operating procedures of the MAGCS Golf Committee, we will implement a change starting with our June meeting at Winnetka Golf Club. All competitors will be required to submit a verifiable USGA Index number in order to be eligible for and qualify for net division prizes. If a member does not have a current USGA Index number, he/she will be moved to the gross division of the event. If the event does not have a gross division, that golfer will be required to play to a 0. At each event, all indexes will be converted to correspond to the slope rating of the host course.

The committee wants to make sure all competitors are playing on equal terms. If you do not have the ability to establish a USGA Index at your home course, you may obtain one through the MAGCS. Paul Yerkes will be our contact to the CDGA in setting up this program and coordinating the reporting of all scores. So if you are interested in establishing a USGA Index, please contact Paul or me. Remember, you must post five scores in order to establish an index.

I am very excited over the quality of courses that we are playing at our monthly events this year. Since so many of our members are moving into the senior division (50 and over) this year, we have a "new" trophy for the winner of the senior gross division. It is the Old Elm Elmer Bertucci Trophy. It is said that Elmer was the first superintendent at Old Elm, and in the early '80s, the manager at Old Elm bestowed the trophy to the MAGCS in Elmer's honor. The trophy was supposed to be a traveling trophy for the winner of the annual senior event, but it

would be responsible for ongoing requirements.


So what happens next? The MSRG will continue to make presentations throughout country through May. They will be collecting information from these presentations as well as from individuals on the Web. Then, in June, they will meet to make their final recommendations. These recommendations will be distributed to all members early in August, prior to the chapter delegates meeting in September, and more than six months before any bylaws vote is scheduled in February of 2001. If adopted, the requirements would go into effect the following year, July 2002.

There are many unanswered questions that relate to the PDI, but the MSRG is working to keep members well informed about this proposal, through constant communication in *Newsline* and with chapters. 
