Reflections on the Passing of Midwest Members, Friends

Our good friend Dudley Smith deserves plaudits for his terrific job in writing recent obituaries in On Course for two good friends to so many of us, John Coghill and "Buz" Didier.

John Coghill and I came together on three distinct occasions of note: we first met as students in 1936 at the University of Massachusetts turf management school in Amherst. This was also Grace and John's honeymoon. Our next "meeting" was when John and I met by chance as patients in an Army hospital in England (1944); both of us had survived action in Normandy. He was an officer in the infantry and I was an officer in the combat engineers. The third time we came together was in 1949, when we attended the Dale Carnegie School of Public Speaking together in Chicago. Many fond memories, to say the least.

As to "Buz" Didier, I became acquainted with Buz when he and his brother David were working with their father, Raymond, in golf course construction. However, I had known Raymond from the 1940s when he was the superintendent at Tam O'Shanter in Niles. Raymond was our first Midwest GCSAA president in 1945 and 1946. Ray was a great innovator and a central figure in promoting golf via television. Ray rebuilt all of their greens and installed phone lines to every tee for the use of the press. After leaving Tam O'Shanter, Ray and his two sons bought a tree nursery in Mundelein, sold off some of the trees and built the Village Green Golf Club, which the family operated for a number of This winter we also lost Peter Voykin, whose passing was well-reported by his brother Paul. This was quite a shock for all of us Midwest members.

The passing of these Midwest members leaves me with the feeling that at the present time, we have probably the greatest camaraderie within our membership that we have ever witnessed in our long history, dating back to 1926. Incidentally, MY first attendance dates back to approximately 1930! May I congratulate our present membership of today, each and every one of you, on your professionalism and enthusiasm—attributes we should and can all be proud of.

The following are highlights of the MAGCS Board of Directors meeting held Tuesday, June 3 at Bartlett Hills Golf Course. Full meeting minutes, once approved, are available on the Midwest Web site.

- On Course contributing editor John Gurke presented a survey authored by Cathy Ralston working in collaboration with Dave Braasch and his entire Editorial Committee. It is a comprehensive On Course readership survey that was to be e-mailed/ mailed to all Midwest members in June. The goal is to gain input to further improve an already solid magazine. The Board recommended several minor changes to be implemented before sending out the survey. Sylvia Lima indicated she would encourage commercial members to respond to the survey.
- Fred Behnke reported 20 applicants for the MAGCS executive director position.
- The Board voted to switch from the charge-it system presently used
