During his career Bruce has trained and coached over 140 men and women who have gone on to become superintendents. Topics covered in his talk will include: how to prepare, methods and tactics, and how to make yourself the most attractive candidate for the job. It will be a great learning experience for everyone in attendance.

The afternoon session will be run by incoming GCSAA President, Mr. Dave Downing, CGCS. Downing is the Vice President of Operations/Construction for the Signature Golf Group,

headquartered in Myrtle Beach, South Carolina. He is a graduate of the Penn State Turfgrass Management Program. He spent eleven years as a course superintendent at four clubs, notably the TPC of Connecticut and the Las Vegas Country Club. From 1998 to 2002, Downing acted as Director of Golf Course Operations for Barefoot Resort & Golf, situated in Myrtle Beach. He led the construction of these four world renowned courses, the first 72-hole facility to open all four courses on the same day. This session will focus on how professionals in our field can utilize GCSAA, and its many resources. Not only will you learn where you can access the resources, you will also be shown how you can use them to benefit you and your facility.
