PRESIDENT' MESSAGE

CONGRATULATIONS, Mike Bavier on being elected Vice President of the G.C.S.A.A., a great choice for a demanding job. I am proud of our members, who worked so very hard to get Mike elected. Paul Voykin, Len Berg, and Carl Hopphan, our delegates, did an outstanding job; but all our members helped by talking to their friends, class mates, and acquaintances. We all can be proud of the job that was done. A big "Thank You" is needed for the contribution of time and resources of members, who made the Midwest Hospitality Room in St. Louis one of the best.

A new Turf Program is being started at the University of Illinois with a complete new staff being hired. BLUEGRASS BLENDS

Plant breeding has provided many special selections of Kentucky bluegrass, such as Merion, Fylking, Park and Prato. Each has its special attributes, -- and each its specific diseases. Wise seedsmen blend several varieties together, to gain from the virtues of each. They thus forestall epidemics which might level the lawn if all grass were alike. Sod growers, too, are beginning to offer blends, for this very same reason.

FERTILIZER FOR NEW SEEDING

Fertilizer mixed into a lawn seedbed, or soil under new sod, should be rich in phosphorus. Phosphorus is one of the major nutrients needed for sturdy root growth and general tone. Bluegrass-fine fescue lawns especially benefit. Phosphorus is fixed by soil and if applied only at the surface may not quickly reach the root zone. Mixing it into the seedbed makes certain that this vital element occurs where the roots can reach it.

FINE FESCUES RESPOND TO SEASON

The fine-leafed lawn fescues are especially resplendant in spring and autumn, responding well to the cooler weather. In southerly locations they may dull down in summer; Kentucky bluegrass is usually combined with fescue in the seed blend to better maintain uniform summer consistency.

MOWERS FOR BLUEGRASS

Individual Kentucky bluegrass plants arch gracefully erect. Only the tip of the newest leaf is mowed before it matures and bends back. Rotary lawn mowers are quite suitable for accomplishing this evenly, especially types having a strong vertical draft that sucks wayward blades up into the cutting chamber.

WATER LAWNS WITH PLASTIC

Underground plastic systems for irrigating home lawns have proven quite durable. At the Lawn Institute wave sprinklers activated by a time clock have endured three winters without damage. These inexpensive installations are especially useful for bentgrass swards such as Penncross or Highland.

PENNCROSS BENTGRASS

Penncross is an outstanding creeping bentgrass available from seed. The name was chosen because strains of grass selected at Pennsylvania State University are let cross naturally in the Oregon seed-growing fields. The ''hybrid'' seed yields especially vigorous turf.

IF YOU THINK A GOLF COURSE IS THERE, BECAUSE IT'S THERE, READ THIS ...

At 6:30 a.m. a golf course begins to come alive. The sleepy idle chirp of birds, the quiet sleepiness of a morning is interrupted by the almost silent hum of electric carts being dispersed to different areas of the course to shut off special sprinklers or to turn them on for an hour or so before the golfers appear. Then comes the quiet putt-putt of the mowers used to trim the surfaces of the greens and almost simultaneously, the swish, swish of bamboo poles sweeping the dew off the green's surface. And, in these early hours, too, the traps are raked, the tee markers positioned and the pins placed.

These are the things we seldom see. Now the work to repair the damage to turf and greens after a hard weekend of play, or the diligence with which roughs and fairways are trimmed to playable levels, not to mention the greens.

But it's done. Day in and day out. Mostly when you're not around. All you have to do is come and enjoy it. And part of that enjoyment is, perhaps, grousing a little that the tees aren't mowed enough (or too much) or that greens are too slow or too fast, or that the rough is too low or too high. That's the privilege of Membership.

It's also the joy of getting out there on a beautiful sunny day and just reveling in the beauty of these God-given, man-made surroundings and saying, "Golly, it's great to be alive." And it's the heartwarming feeling of beaming back at a guest from another club who says, as so many do, "This is one of the most beautiful, best cared-for courses I've seen anywhere!"

That's the Pride of Membership.

And how does it all happen? Man, there's a lot of tough physical labor out there. And, last but not least his staff. They've done a fantastic job all year. We're sure every member of the Club joins us in a thanks, well done.




