


Is the objective of this august organization to eliminate all noise we asked.







The members of the Sod Growers Association of Mid-America who serve the entire Chicago-metro area as well as southern Wisconsin and north-western Indiana announce that beginning with the 1982 season they will harvest and market their sod by the square foot rather than the square yard. The majority of the rest of the U.S. already markets by the square foot and the local growers feel it will be to everyone's advantage to standardize. Most growers will probably harvest a 10 square foot roll thereby effecting an 11% efficiency of handling to both the grower and the installer. Measuring for and ordering sod will also become less confusing in that measurements are all made in square feet and the conversion to square yard will be avoided.

The S.G.A. members feel the time has come to streamline the standards in the sod industry and that this change is a step in that direction.


