Update at Purdue

A Turfgrass Extension Specialist will be hired to join the faculty of the Department of Agronomy at Purdue University. This person will fill the opening created when Dr. Freeborg retired. The funding for this position will come from state appropriations to Purdue University. This will be the first time that two turfgrass specialists at Purdue University will be supported by state funds.

The individual hired as the Turfgrass Extension Specialists will be responsible for planning and coordinating the annual Turf Conference, Turf Field Day and Turf and Ornamental Pesticide Use Seminars. This individual will also interact with professional turf managers through meetings, newsletters and publications in trade magazines. A portion of the Turfgrass Extension Specialist's time will be spent to help homeowners with their turf problems. This will be accomplished by training session for County Agents and writing extension bulletins. The individual hired will also devote some time to research in an area of his interest.

Dr. Throssell will be responsible for teaching all the turfgrass courses and be the leader of the turfgrass research efforts. Dr. Throssell will continue to serve as Executive Secretary of the Midwest Regional Turf Foundation and participate in extension activities.

The presence of two individuals at Purdue devoting all their time to turfgrass is a major step forward for the turfgrass program. This will allow us to be more active in teaching, research and extension. Since the Turfgrass Extension Specialist's salary will be paid for by state appropriations the money raised by the Midwest Regional Turf Foundation can be directed toward research. Once an individual is hired and familiar with the position we will be able to accomplish much more than we have in the past.

The Turfgrass Extension Specialist position is open immediately and qualified applicants are encouraged to apply. The minimum educational requirement is an M.S. degree with specialization in turfgrass science. Practical experience working with turfgrass would be helpful. Planting Lawngrass Seed by the Square Inch

Ever wonder about how lawngrass seeding rates are determined? Calculations start with the knowledge that about 6 lawngrass plants per square inch are needed in an established lawn. To get 6 established plants, some 12 seeds per square inch are required in the seeding process. Some seeds will be raked in too deep and others are left on the surface. Neither of these are likely to become well established. Birds may eat some seeds and rainfall may wash other seed away. Not all seeds have equal vigor and some may produce weak seedlings that die from damping off diseases. Experience has shown that about two seeds need be planted for every one that develops into the mature lawn. Since lawngrass seed is so inexpensive, these recommended seeding rates prove to be economical. Use of less than recommended seeding rates will cause the new lawn to be open and weedy and take longer to mature into high quality turf.





Weed Seed Per Square Foot of Soil

Good garden grade topsoil contains as many as 200 viable weed seeds per square foot of surface. These seeds are ready to germinate at any given time and represent only about 5 percent of the total weed seed present in the top 6 inches of soil. Thus, there are in excess of 1 potential weed for each square inch of your newly seeded or established lawn. Vigorous, healthy lawngrasses will not permit these weeds to become established. Named varieties of grasses are best for stopping weeds before they start.

Page of your most recent issue carries an item of great significance. I hope that this will not be the last time that you will carry an item on soil microbes. I'll venture an opinion that the population of microorganisms in putting green soils (sand?) will fall woefully short of the figures quoted for 'lawn soils'.

I have introduced the term "shock absorbers" to help poorly informed people understand some of the functions of the Living Soil complex. Adequately nourished and "adjusted" periodically, the soil complex can absorb many shocks from chemicals, fertilizers that bypass the organisms, heat, cold, flooding, drought and traffic.

Beneficial forms can overpower the pathogenic types when the proper adjustments are made. Some day, perhaps not in my time, soil microbiologists will be able to "assay" the content of the Living Soil so as to guide treatments that favor the diseasesuppressive types. Treatments made to turfgrass will be evaluated for their effect on the soil flora and fauna.

This is only a beginning on creating an awareness of the tremendous value of soil microorganisms and the factors that affect their well being or their demise.

USGA Turfgrass Information File

The USGA Turfgrass Information File (TGIF) provides computer-based bibliographic access to published materials relating to turfgrass research and management. The file is operated as a part of the Turfgrass Information Center at the Michigan State University Libraries. This USGA research project, in cooperation with GCSAA, first became operational in August of 1984 and now includes more than 9400 references, most of which (approximately 85%) include abstracts.

File Purposes and Uses

As a file designed to support the efficient and effective retrieval of research results, TGIF can be exploited to identify source documents discussing particular grasses (or cultivars, for that matter), cultural practices, agents, research methodologies, environmental conditions, etc., alone or in combination. It is also useful as a reference tool, for example, in tying together disease nomenclatural changes, surveying the state of knowledge on a particular insect pest (in the turf context), or quickly identifying who has conducted research on a particular concern. In many cases, the abstracts themselves can provide management guidance based on summary conclusions. And it is unbeatable at identifying that, "I can remember seeing an article on that about a year or so ago ...", item, and quickly, too.

File Scope and Content

To build the file, current published literature from some seventy journals is selectively processed, including these kinds of sources:

RESEARCH: Agronomy Journal, Plant Disease, Phytopathology, Crop Science, Canadian Journal of Plant Science, etc.

TECHNICAL: USGA Green Section Record, California Turfgrass Culture, Golf Course Management, Journal of the Sports Turf Research Institute, etc.

TRADE: Weeds Trees & Turf, Grounds Maintenance, ALA, etc.

In addition, online files and bibliographics from the National Agricultural Library, Commonwealth Agricultural Bureaux (U.K.), Biological Abstracts, etc. will be reviewed regularly to include materials from sources not usually reporting turf research.

Currently over 1200 different serial titles are represented in the database. Included are journals, conference proceedings, research annuals, newsletters, and extension bulletins in addition to the books, papers, theses and dissertations, and special publications that make up the remainder of the file. Over 95% of the file entries have been published since 1968, reflecting the emphasis on recent materials.

Though significant results can be retrieved on most turf topics, it must be noted that the file continues to be "under construction" and cannot be considered "exhaustive" at this time. Coverage of the literature since 1980 is most complete, with the 1972-1979 period less well represented.

The Setting

Designed to compliment and enhance the existing O.J. Noer Memorial Turfgrass Collection at the Michigan State University Library, TGIF is but one element in a three part cooperative effort to develop a Turfgrass Information Center at MSU. The Noer Collection, based on O.J. Noer's personal library and supplemented by gifts from many others, has now grown and
