Ken Shepherd, Wedgewood G.C. is a public fee course with 45-50,000 rounds per year. Height of cut at 5/32" with Triplex mowers and groomers being used. Topdresses with pure sand as often as play and weather allows. Applies 3.8 to 5.8 #N/M per year.

Bruce Sering, Glenview Club showed how to do the "Superintendents Shuffle" when dealing with your green committee. He will be leading a seminar on this tactic in the near future. Bruce believes in taking no pictures or keeping records no discriminating evidence is the reason. Greens stimp at 8.25 to 9.25. Uses Toro 1000 PGM set at 1/8". Used Cutlass at 1 oz./300 gals. per 9 greens. Used Primo at 5 oz./300 gals. per 9 greens every 3 weeks.





Brian Green, Sunset Valley G.C. started in the early 80's to speed up his greens. He chose 1983 to go into this speed up program and was cutting at 1/8" and sanding very heavy. He stated he had "browns" instead of greens, due to the heavy sand being used. The players loved the speed, but it wore Brian out worrying about keeping his greens. 1984 there was a different program and slower greens and Brian slept better there after. He had a special



3 gang roller made up for rolling before and during tournaments and cuts at 5/32" for these events.
