which made it a desirable candidate for an easement. Today, roughly 180 acres of the course are protected by an easement.

"After we bought the property, CorLands called us and introduced us to the savings and tax benefits," said Brett Baarstad, owner and general manager of the course. "It goes right to the bottom line. The benefits and tax savings are really substantial. You think that in order to get savings like that, you have to do quite a bit of work, but it was really very simple.

"Our thinking is that we're in the golf business to stay and we want this to stay a golf course. It's a beautiful piece of property with quite a bit of floodplain that is worked into the design . . . Protecting the area was a big concern of the forest preserve district.

"We still get all the wildlife out there as when we started out ... It's a win-win for everybody."

Chlordane per acre successfully put an end to worm casts within a week of application (this was the top story in the December, 1950 *Bull Sheet*).

Two methods were used: Pounding zinc-treated (galvanized) nails into the trunks on 2" centers at breast height; and drilling 1/2'' holes at a downward angle around the trunk at breast height on 2" centers and filling them with zinc chloride, followed by stopping the holes with 1/2'' dowels. 30 years ago this month in MAGCS: President Dick Trevarthan passed the gavel to Joe Canale at the 18th Annual Turf Clinic. The 48th Annual Midwest Turf Clinic, Revisited

As has become tradition, Medinah Country Club was the host of the 48th Midwest Turf Clinic. Registration numbered over 175 members in attendance. With a strong program in place, none were disappointed.

The MAGCS Annual Meeting kicked off the day, including all of the committee reports with President Ferreri presiding. Following adjournment of the business portion of the meeting, Cathy Ralston, editor of *On Course*, presented the Ray Gerber Editorial Award. This year's recipient was Dave Braasch, superintendent at Hughes Creek

Golf Course. Dave's winning article, "Be a Lifesaver! Basic Medical Procedures You Should Know," came from the June 2000 issue.

Fred Yelverton, Ph.D., N.C. State, was the first speaker to take the podium. Dr. Yelverton discussed his research on *Poa annua* reduction on golf course putting greens. This topic is timeless and new technology has yet to make a significant impact. Dr. Yelverton is available for questions via e-mail at Fred_Yelverton@ncsu.edu.

A roundtable discussion was the format used to pose questions to the Midwest's new superintendents. Panelists were Jon Jennings, CGCS, Shane Kissack, Alan Perkinson and Keith Peterson. For each, this was his first season in his present position. They all discussed the challenges and unique situations encountered in their first year at a new facility.

Oscar Miles, CGCS brought the morning session to a close with his presentation of "Inside the Ropes," related to conducting the 55th U.S. Women's Open Championship at Merit Club. Oscar explained the procedures needed to run a major tournament at your golf course. In typical Oscar fashion, he was very animated and spoke his mind freely. It was truly a learning experience.

The afternoon session was divided among two exceptional speakers. Steve Mona, CEO, GCSAA, delivered a very informative "state of the association." He included all aspects of the GCSAA, past, present and future. Following his presentation, he entertained questions regarding our national association.
