
On November 16, 1989, Oscar started work at The Merit Club. His first task, which took two months, was to write the budget and specifications for the project. Next, Oscar began to hire a staff to do grassing, grow-in and maintenance over the next two years.

"At that time, it was unusual for a golf course maintenance staff to do all this," reflects Oscar. "Developers usually waited until a course was grassed, then they would hire a superintendent and say, now put a team together to take care of it. But with us doing it hole by hole—we'd plant it, landscape it, grow it in and then get it ready for play—that's a tremendous advantage."

By fall of 1990, only four holes had been shaped, leaving 17 (the balance of the championship 18, plus three practice holes) for completion during 1991. In fall of '91, nine holes and the three practice holes opened for play. July 4, 1992, marked the grand opening of the entire course and its warm, intimate clubhouse.

"By being involved from the beginning, I had the opportunity to take 28 years of experience and education and apply it in a practical way," Oscar remarks. "I used the latest scientific information to plant the proper grasses, the correct trees, choose the right sand for the bunkers, keep the proper distance between bunkers, confine the fairways and create nice rolling contours so the course is aesthetically pleasing. The staff that did the grassing here became the maintenance staff. Now with the 10 years of experience we have with this course, we are ready to bring it into condition for the U.S. Women's Open."

Ed couldn't be more pleased that events transpired as they did. "In hiring Oscar Miles, who is acknowledged as one of the best in his profession, the golf course right now is as good a quality of golf course as you can find in the industry. We're very proud of the condition of the golf course and we think it's because we started doing it on the high end from day one."

Next: The Merit Club as a showcase for golf coexisting with nature, and a look at Oscar's top-notch staff.

"Ed [Oldfield, president of The Merit Club] felt it was very important to bring a golf course superintendent in on the ground floor. The person who would be taking care of the golf course should develop the specifications and oversee the construction to ensure it was done properly. That interested me quite a bit."

# Taps Our Own Bob Maibusch For One-Year Term as Director

"Scott indicated he needed to make an appointment, and based on my past experience with committees and service record, they wanted to see if I was interested," Bob recalls.

Bob did not—indeed, could not—accept the invitation before discussing the offer with two key contingents: his employer, Hinsdale Golf Club, and his family. Serving a one-year appointment would mean, for instance, some 30 days of travel during his term.

"The course came back to me with an answer within a day, and they were very encouraging," says Bob. "My wife and kids were also supportive. It would have been hard to say no at that point."

Since accepting the directorship, Bob has undergone extensive computer training in the use of GCSAA's intranet and made a couple trips to Lawrence, KS; he will make a third for the GCSAA's May board meeting, at which time his appointment should be confirmed. Bob has also been charged with chairing two GCSAA committees: the Publications Committee and the Limited Budget Resource Group.

This latter group, explains Bob, is an ad hoc committee formed to look at the challenges faced by superintendents working at limited budget facilities. "GCSAA felt this group might be falling through the cracks, and this committee focuses on them—to see what we can do to






So what happens next? The MSRG will continue to make presentations throughout country through May. They will be collecting information from these presentations as well as from individuals on the Web. Then, in June, they will meet to make their final recommendations. These recommendations will be distributed to all members early in August, prior to the chapter delegates meeting in September, and more than six months before any bylaws vote is scheduled in February of 2001. If adopted, the requirements would go into effect the following year, July 2002.

There are many unanswered questions that relate to the PDI, but the MSRG is working to keep members well informed about this proposal, through constant communication in *Newsline* and with chapters. 
