I had convinced myself that if need be the course could make it through the night without any water. Finally, at 6:30 p.m., the UPS guy arrived with my VFD drive. I called Chris to let him know the package had arrived. He told me it would take him 30 minutes to get there and then a couple hours to be up and running again, if I needed to water that night. At this point I was exhausted from all that was going on with this whole situation, but through my afternoon travels around the course things looked okay. So I made the decision to have him come first thing in the morning to do the install, convinced the course would be fine without water for another evening.

The next day, Chris was there first thing in the morning and amazingly everything went quite smoothly. By 10 a.m., Chris had everything up and running and back to normal. I spent the rest of the morning turning heads on here and there just because I could again. The only concern I had was the approaching 90° weather. But after the whole ordeal I had just gone through, I had a boost in my confidence to handle anything that would come my way.

What a great experience for me to prove my abilities, interact with members and learn what it is a superintendent must do everyday. It was experience and training I could not learn in school or on the job with the superintendent there. I am sure it took a lot of courage on my superintendent's part to leave the assistant in charge for a week in the middle of summer, but it was the greatest compliment I could receive in regard to my ability to do the job and make the difficult decisions. Hearing from the boss that he would not have handled it any differently and that he was not worried when he was gone really made me feel good. This is truly a win-win scenario for both the superintendent and the assistant.



Danville Area Community College Initiates One-Year One-Year Certificate Program For Golf Course Mechanics



Ask a superintendent, "Who is your most valuable employee?" and he or she might very well answer, "My mechanic." Most of us have been assistants at one time or another, but are a little further removed from the days of grinding reels and adjusting carburetors. If we can help it, very few of us want to get back under a mower and if you don't have a qualified equipment technician running the shop, the task of maintaining a high-quality facility is nearly impossible. Additionally, there is a well-documented shortage of qualified technicians available (supported by the routine allegations of "mechanic stealing"). However, the tide could be turning due in part to a new training program at downstate Danville Area Community College (DACC).

... this program is going to graduate some excellent technicians and help raise the professional bar of the industry. The one-year certificate program will graduate its second crop this summer. In an ongoing effort to market the program and as an alumni of beloved DACC, I would like to let you know a bit more about the program. Perhaps you have an employee who could use the formal training or you yourself regularly speak at career days. There so seems to be a general lack of career awareness, so please keep the DACC program in mind if you ever get the chance to talk to high school students!

DACC, of course, has a well-established golf course management program. In fact, the faculty was encouraged to start this new training program at the beckoning of superintendents, many alumni of DACC. These same superintendents assisted the faculty in shaping the program—a real plus. Larry Korte, an instructor at DACC since 1971, teaches the majority of the courses. Mr. Korte has an extensive farming background and has taught auto mechanic, electrical and computer-related classes over the years. The one-year certificate program includes classroom work from August-March and concludes with an internship in April-July.

- Turfgrass Culture


SPRING SEMESTER




