PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO BY-LAWS

The Nominating Committee has suggested that the membership consider amending Article V, Section 2 of our By-Laws which currently states: "President. It shall be the duty of the President to preside at all the meetings of the members, the Board of Directors and the Executive Committee. He shall appoint all special committees and he shall be an ex-officio member of all regular and special committees. He shall, at least thirty days prior to the date of the Annual Meeting, appoint a Nominating Committee, WHICH SHALL CON-SIST OF FIVE (5) MEMBERS WHO SHALL BE CHARTER OR CLASS A MEMBERS OF THIS ASSOCIATION. IT SHALL BE THE DUTY OF THE NOMINATING COMMITTEE TO NOMINATE TWO (2) CANDIDATES FOR EACH OFFICE TO BE FILLED, AND TWO (2) CANDIDATES FOR EACH DIRECTORSHIP TO BE FILLED, PROVIDED, HOWEVER, THAT NOMINATIONS FOR ANY OFFICE OR DI-RECTORSHIP TO BE ILLED MAY BE MADE FROM THE FLOOR AT THE ANNUAL MEET-ING. The President shall have the deciding vote in any matter if the vote by the members results in a tie."

Article V, Section 2 as proposed: "President. It shall be the duty of the President to preside at all the meetings of the members, the Board of Directors and the Executive Committee. He shall appoint all special committees and he shall be an ex-officio member of all regular and special committees. He shall, at least thirty (30) days prior to the date of the Annual Meeting, appoint a Nominating Committee WHICH SHALL CONSIST OF THE LAST FIVE (5) PAST PRE-SIDENTS OF HIS ASSOCIATION. IT SHALL BE THE DUTY OF THE NOMINATING COM-MITTEE TO NOMINATE ONE (1) CANDI-DATE FOR THE OFFICE OF PRESIDENT: TWO (2) CANDIDATES FOR EACH OF THE OFFICES OF 1ST VICE-PRESIDENT, 2ND VICE-PRESIDENT AND SECRETARY-TREAS-URER; AND TWO (2) CANDIDATES FOR EACH DIRECTORSHIP TO BE FILLED, PRO-VIDED, HOWEVER, THAT NOMINATIONS FOR ANY OFFICE OR DIRECTORSHIP TO BE FILLED MAY BE MADE FROM THE FLOOR AT THE ANNUAL MEETING. The President shall have the deciding vote in any matter if the vote by the members results in a tie."


Your Board of Directors suggests that the membership consider amending Article 11, Section 2, Class E — Associate Member which states: "To qualify for membership in this class, an applicant shall be a COM-MERCIAL REPRESENTATIVE who is sufficiently interested in our profession to attend meetings and work for the advancement of this Association and who does not qualify for membership in another membership class. Such members"

Article 11, Section 2, Class E — Members as proposed: "To qualify for membership in this class, an applicant shall be be ANYONE who is sufficiently interested in our profession to attend meetings and work for the advancement of this Association and who does not qualify for membership in another membership class. Such members shall be entitled to all of the privileges of this Association except that he shall not vote or hold office. Class E members may be dismissed from the business meetings at the discreation of the President. Effective January 1, 1959, it will be mandatory that Slass E members be a member of the Golf Course Superintendents Association of America."

The above proposed revisions will be discussed and voted upon at the Annual Meeting of this Association at 9:45 A.M. on Wednesday, December 6, 1961 at the Olympia Fields Coutry Club.




