The 1988-1989 Publications Catalog published by the American Society of Agronomy, Crop Science Society of America and Soil Science Society of America embraces a wealth of new information.


The catalog contains information on 26 books, 19 monographs, 43 special publications, eight periodicals, 12 slide sets and six other publications.
