State law requires land disturbance activities of five acres or more to have a permit to discharge storm water.

"Many owners and developers are not aware that they may need a storm water discharge permit," said DNR Director David Shorr.

Permits should be applied for 90 days before start of construction.

There is a \$150 fee for a general permit, and certain activities are exempt.
