UTAH DEQ HEAD WANTS BALANCE SALT LAKE CITY, Utah — Dr. Dianne R. Nielson, the new executive director of the Utah Department of Environmental Quality, says she will strive for balance in considering the impact of economic development on the environment.

Appointed on Jan 4, Nielson, a geologist, said in the DEQ newsletter that she believes everything is interconnected and "environmental quality, environmental protection is part of that connection. It is a balance: What we do as individuals with our lifestyles, how we work with industry and the land, how industries, governments and individuals operate within our state."

While maintaining that the environment is precious, she added: "We also need to look at workable business regulation. That means if an operator comes to us requesting a permit, we need to realize the operator is our customer."

Nielson said she will seek ways to find workable ways to facilitate a discussion.

"There are regulations we need to follow, and we need to make sure those are enforced," she said. "But we must also ask how we can best facilitate the project within the requirement of regulations."
