

GCSAA '96-97 Scholars recognized

LAWRENCE, Kan. — Eleven undergraduate college students have been recognized for high performance and achievement by the Golf Course Superintendents Association of America (GCSAA) Foundation with their selection as 1996-97 GCSAA Scholars.

Since 1956, The GCSAA Foundation has awarded scholarships to outstanding students planning careers as superintendents or in a related field. A student must be an undergraduate who has completed 24 credit hours of study. Honorees receive stipends ranging from \$2,000 to \$3,500. Awards are based upon academic excellence, appropriate career preparation and the potential to make an outstanding professional contribution. GCSAA Scholars will attend the 68th International Golf Course Conference and Show Feb. 6-12, 1997 in Las Vegas to be honored at the Friends of the Foundation reception.

The top-rated applicant is afforded the Mendenhall Award, named in honor of the late Chet Mendenhall, a charter member of GCSAA and a recent Kansas Golf Hall of Fame inductee. This year's Mendenhall designee is J. Paul Robertson of Olds College, Alberta, Canada.
