## UNIQUE DYE MARKING SYSTEM

The multi-talented team of Bill Larson, CGCS, Ryan Browning and Erik Tolzmann, assistant superintendents, and Mike Romundstad, golf course mechanic, at the Town \& Country Club in Saint Paul, Minn., have devised a very efficient and unique dye marking system for their 1992 SmithCo 100-gallon green and tee sprayer booms. A 5-gallon soda fountain dispensing tank - obtained free from the clubhouse - has 3 ounces of Becker Underwood Turf Mark Dye added that is mixed together during transport. A CO2 tank, filled at Praxaire for less than $\$ 10$, is filled with 160 pounds providing 3-5 psi pressure to the two small ball valves located on either side of the steering wheel that control the dye to each respective spray boom. A $1 / 4$-inch diameter flexible plastic hose runs from the ball valves to the end of each boom and then $1 / 4$-inch flexible rubber fuel line hoses are used for the Tee-Jet flat spray nozzles hanging on the boom ends. The nozzles are turned sideways so a very narrow spray line can be turned on and off creating a dashed line or a solid spray line. Material cost was
 about $\$ 75$ and it took about three hours to install.
