S. California Greenkeepers Hold Second Show By W. W. STEWART

SECOND ANNUAL turf equipment exhibit sponsored by the Greenkeepers' Assn. of Southern California was held again this year at the grounds of the Bel-Air C. C., Monday, April 11. Greenkeepers and course officials from as widely divergent points as San Diego and San Francisco came to Los Angeles to view the very latest in golf course equipment. The 20 exhibitors had a group of 300 enthusiastic prospective buyers present to see the demonstration of their wares, which ranged from gang mowers to hose menders.

Being a demonstration as well as an exhibition, the show was of particular value to turf growers because they were able to view machinery and equipment under actual working conditions and were able to compare working abilities of various brands of one type of machine.
