

Five of the 15 aces made to mid-season in the Baltimore district were made at the 13th hole of the Terra Mariae CC. . . . Gala opening day festivities for the new 18-hole golf layout at the Valdosta (Ga.) CC were held July 25. No entry or green fee was charged and visitors were served fish dinners.

University of New Mexico officials are working on preliminary plans for a proposed golf course. . . . Nearly all work has been completed on the clubhouse at the Oconto (Wis.) G&CC. . . . Harry Smith, Green Brook CC, North Caldwell, N.J., pro, figuring a perfect game of golf as one stroke to reach the green on a par-3 hole, two strokes on a par-4 hole and three on a par-5 hole, believes this feat is accomplished less often than a holein-one by the average golfer. . . . Mike Turnesa, assistant pro at the Fairview CC, Elmsford, N.Y., was married recently.

The USGA, in its most recent publicity bulletin, announced that members of USGA clubs can get reduced "season" tickets for men's women's national amateur championships. "It is probable that the idea will be applied to all future USGA competitions for which admission is charged," says Frank Hardt, USGA secretary. . . . Thomas Odhams, pro at the Royal Ghent GC in Belgium, narrowly escaped getting rough treatment as a Nazi parachute trooper when he was fleeing the German invasion with a stock of clubs and balls. Belgian peasants thought the clubs and balls were "secret weapons."

The Green Section of the USGA has announced a recent change in publication plans. In order to reach interested greensmen at more frequent intervals with items of interest on turf maintenance, they have issued "Timely Turf Topics." The "Topics" will be issued on letterhead size paper, and will go out probably monthly. "Turf Culture" will continue to be issued with the same style of material as was included in the 1939 volume. . . .
