tank sprayer followed by a thorough drenching of approximately 1 in. of water. Lyons got what he thinks are near 100 per cent results.

Course Toughened

As a result of close cooperation between the architect, directors of the club and Lyons, Firestone boasts one of the finest 18 holes in the country. Jones' suggestions included two new greens, two strategically placed ponds, and enough traps to provide sand piles for an entire generation of two-year olds. The course was lengthened 600 vds, and now measures 7,165 vds.

Three holes may be long remembered: the 3rd, par 4; the 16th, par 5; and the 18th, par 4. The third measures 450 yds. with a 6,000 sq. ft. pond directly in front of the green. The sixteenth is 625 yds., has been carefully trapped, and it, too, has a pond directly in the line of approach. The eighteenth, 465 yds., is said to be one of the finest finishing holes in the country. It dog-legs to the left to a spectacular 8,500-sq. ft. green.

About \$750,000 was spent in getting Firestone CC ready for the PGA Championship. Besides making wide improvements on the course, the club installed an underground communication system, one of the first of its kind in U.S.

## Golf Writer Memberships Listed **Under Two Classifications**

Membership in the Golf Writers Assn. of America hereafter will be under two classifications: Regular members covering fulltime newspaper and press service men, regular employees of golf publications, columnists and sports editors; Associate members covering free lance writers, manufacturers' public relations staff men and others not regularly employed in writing everyday golf.

The GWAA also is considering establishment of a golf hall of fame.

Deadline for entries in the fourth annual Burke-PGA golf writing awards has been extended to Oct. 15 to include articles submitted as the result of coverage of the International Amateur team matches to be played at Merion. As in the past, \$1,000 is being put up for what are judged to be the best news and feature articles.
