





The Odessa (Tex.) Pro-Am, which started as a \$5,000 event in 1949, has become a \$15,000 affair . . . Twenty-one touring pros played in it this year with Don January and Amateur Dick Jennings of Lubbock taking first place with a combined 258 . . . The second Pioneer Pass tournament, which will be played over two courses and plenty of terrain, Oct, 7-9, may be the most unusual golf event in the world . . .
