According to Audubon International. 317 bird total species were identified on 68 golf courses nationwide during its 2004 North American Birdwatching Open held this spring. The Open was held over 24 hours on golf courses that participate in the Audubon Cooperative Sanctuary and Audubon Signature Programs. Eagles Landing Golf Course in Berlin, Md., had the highest number of bird species sighted with 95. Overall, the top species sighted were:

- Warblers 32
- Hawks 13
- Woodpeckers -10


