I'll have a Select 55. Low-cal beer. It's as good as regular beer.

We're a blue collar track. It's an easy track to walk. We don't have a lot of elevation

changes. The beginners and experienced golfers both have a good time.

I watched a lot of the U.S. Open. That was a tough course. My golfers... they would still be playing that course today.

We have one full-time superintendent, and two seasonal staff, plus an intern. I'm the general manager, but I spend 90 percent of my time working out on the course.

I enjoy golfing — as long as it's at someone else's course. I can't relax when I play here!

I save all my *Golfdoms* in a pile until October or November, then I dig in. Because it's so hectic during the season... by the time you get home from work, it's time to get ready for bed.

The best thing about my job is the variety. My office is a 100-some acres instead of an 8-by-10 cubicle.

I've been married (to Debbie) 25 years. We have two daughters, one is 22 (Alicia), the other is 9 (McKenzie). Alicia is a high school math teacher and a softball coach. She played softball in college, and now her little sister is getting into it. So we're starting all over with it again.
