WORTHINGTON IMPROVES MODELS FOR 1934

TORO ADDS REFINEMENTS AND NEW MODELS

Minneapolis, Minn.-A number of worthwhile improvements and additions to the Toro Manufacturing Co. line of golf course maintenance machinery have been made for 1934, according to word received from K. E. Goit, Toro sales manager.
