"Probably much poor turf of last season was due to poor soil conditions on the putting greens. At the time of reconditioning putting green topsoil, mineral deficiencies should be corrected. A more satisfactory catch has been obtained when some available nitrogen has been supplied."

"The fact that feeding has remarkable value in assisting trees to withstand the effects of drought and heat should not be taken to mean that trees should not be watered in time of drought and heat. But feeding alone may pull trees through where water is not available or is not supplied."

"Startling improvement effected by rational feeding of poor fairways is largely responsible for the increasing interest in fairway fertilization. The folly of attempting renovation with seed alone is now generally recognized, and the scarcity of good manure is compelling the substitution of more concentrated products.

"Fertilizers are best applied in spring or fall and should never be used on fairways in midsummer, when limited rainfall prevents active turf growth. . . . During the balance of the season growth of the grasses is encouraged, and the major effects of the fertilizers disappear before crab-grass germinates the next year."

"In general, any method of fertilization in which nitrogenous materials were used on Virginia bent reduced the abundance of weeds. Manure has increased the number of weed seeds considerably, probably because of weed seeds introduced. . . . Poa annua was least troublesome where nitrogen only was added as fertilizer. . . . Earthworm activities were far greater where organic fertilizers were used than where inorganic was applied.

Rutgers Short Course Ends Seventh Annual Session

FOR the seventh consecutive year, a one-week intensive course in the principles of turf management for golf courses and lawns, was conducted by the College of Agriculture, Rutgers University, February 18 to 22 inclusive. There was an attendance of 22 greenkeepers, pros, seedsmen and landscape architects, of which 14 were from New Jersey, and 8 from other states. Instruction was provided by staff members of the College Agriculture and State Agricultural Experiment Station, under the leadership of Howard B. Sprague, agronomist.

At a dinner held the evening of February 22, which brought the course to a close, certificates of attendance were presented by Prof. F. G. Helyar, director of short courses, and acting dean of the College of Agriculture.

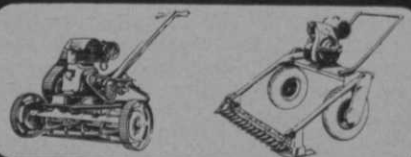

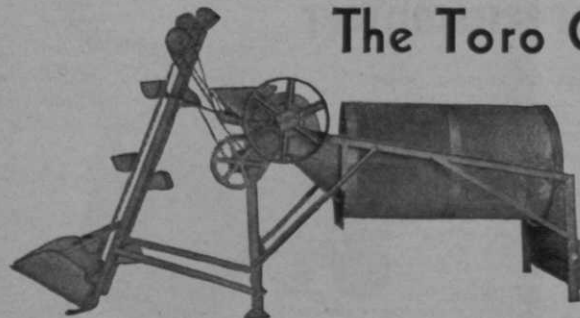

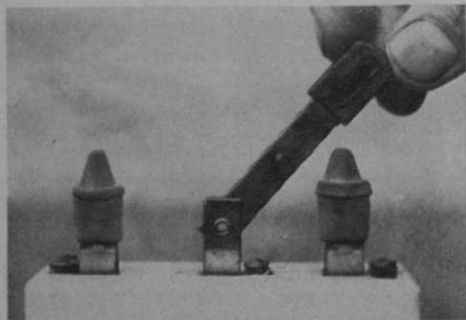

Use Pencil Erasure to Block Knife Switch Contacts

WIRES ARE often quite difficult or unhandy to safely disconnect from small knife switches, and it is frequently necessary and expedient to block one or both



circuits when out of use during the winter. To prevent an accidental or ignorant closing of the switch, a neat little method is shown above.

Force a common lead pencil eraser tip over one or both of the blade clips; the blade then cannot be readily dropped or even forced into contact. The tips fit the clips snugly and place a safe amount of insulating rubber over them.

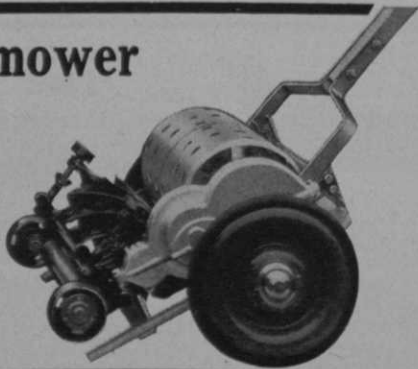

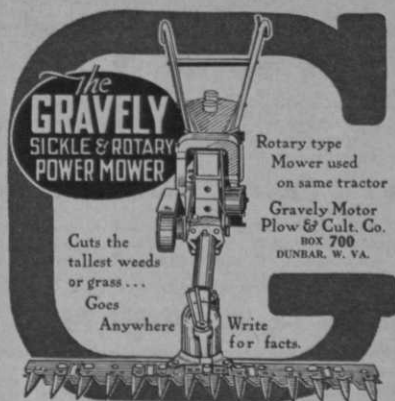

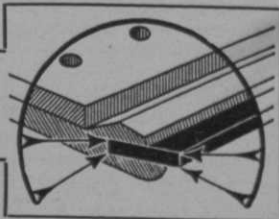
