THE RULES OF GOLF AT A GLANCE . . . SAND TRAPS

Ball within club length. Lift ball nearest hole until further is played, then replace. If original lie is altered, choose nearest similar lie. If ball which has not been lifted is moved by opponent, he loses hole.

You must play from casual water in hazards, or take one stroke penalty for dropping either in or outside hazard. Once Rule 27 (f) which was if ball came from tree, you may teep in the tree.

Branch A may be removed because it does not touch the hazard, but after your ball is in the trap, branch B, touching trap, may not be lifted.

If steps, ripples, areas free of mounds, if not, place ball in nearest similar lie.

Grass-covered slopes are not part of a sand trap—only the exposed will be sand.

Irregularities need be removed. If ball is moved in so doing, replace.

Ball completely covered with sand. Okay to sweep away sand, but only until you see top of ball, no more.

You may "swing" but not swing to clear sand. If you do, it's a stroke by stopping for sand.

Don't touch or remove stones, mounds or natural obstructions. "Man-made" obstructions may be lifted.

WARNING: This chart deals only with sand-traps. There are other types of hazards, to which some of the statements here do not apply.

GOOD PRACTICE

- Enter and leave trap when back is lowest
- Detach sand surface as little as possible
- Scrub out your footprints and sand "divots"
- Do not permit your caddy to enter the trap

PENALTY FOR VIOLATIONS Unless Otherwise Stated

Match Play . . . Loss of Hole
Stroke Play . . . Two Strokes

As instead of some it is not a part of a sand trap. The sand "barrier" rules apply.

He penalizes for touching leaves, etc., while searching for ball, but not once touching after you find it.

Shovel to touch sand with this grip is disallowed.

In casual club does not scrape into sand on the backswing.

Subs of bushes, or anything growing may be touched anytime during address or swing.

Forfeiture, etc., may be considered one further stroke, if lie of ball is not improved by subsequent stroke allowed. Heart implies hole, and that's about it.

You will lose hole if you play opponent's ball unless he is in this place point, in which case finish hole with ball exchanged, or first stroke due to wrong information from opponent or his caddy. If mistake (f) is discovered before opponent plays his next stroke, verify by dropping near as possible to spot where ball lay, not possible. If you play another's ball, no penalty if you had opponent before he plays his next shot. However, you lose hole. Stroke play: no penalty for playing wrong ball while in hazard; two strokes if you hit it after leaving trap. In stroke play you may play with own ball before next drive or be disqualified.

Don't test consistency of sand with your club, club or otherwise prior to stroke.

In match, if opponent's ball moves from rest, replace promptly or play from new lie. In stroke play, replace or be disqualified.
