freshly cut plant across the sickle bar's full 3-foot width. A baffle plate above the nozzles makes certain that all the weed killing chemical goes down onto the



plants, and prevents spray drift which might damage adjacent crops. Chemicals are carried in a $3\frac{1}{2}$ -gallon pressure tank mounted on the mower handle bars enabling the operator to cover a large area at one filling. In addition to weed killing, the new Cunningham unit is said to be highly effective for spraying ammonium sulfamate in the control of poison ivy.
