Thomas Tapes Trouble For Iowa Turf Conference

At the 26th turfgrass short course held at Iowa State University this spring a new type presentation was made, designed to make the audience doubly aware of the importance of sound in the study of preventive maintenance.

Roger J. Thomas, commercial products mgr. of Jacobsen Manufacturing Co., used a combination of tape sounds, a slide presen-tation and oral instruction to make the unique presentation. Pointing out that recognition of trouble-warning sounds apply to all mechanized maintenance equipment, including power mowers, Thomas showed some 150 persons how recognizing these sounds and doing



these sounds and doing something about them can give "thou-

sands of dollars of relief to the budget."

Explaining that even a new born babe has an innate fear of noises, Thomas said that man goes through a noise evolution during which recognition of sounds becomes a normal part of calm, everyday life. "However," he said, "the slightest squeak or rattle in a car will cause the owner to head straight for a mechanic, yet we seem to feel that noises in lawn mowers eventually will disappear.

"Recognizing a singing bearing noise in time," Thomas continued, "results in a \$4.50 replacement cost. Failure to recognize it, or not doing anything about it, may result in more than \$75.00 damage to an engine and mower."

Thomas punctuated his talk with actual sounds from troublesome machinery . . . asking the audience if anyone recognized the danger signals. This was done through the medium of a tape recorder.

The slide portion of the program consisted of photos showing results of not paying attention to sound. They depicted bearing and gear failures, reel wear and general equipment deterioration.

It was pointed out that the purpose of the recorded sounds was not to teach the audience actual recognition of exact prob-

lems, but to realize the importance of noticing and doing something about any warning signals. "Too often," Thomas said, "maintenance men, as well as the average consumer, wait until equipment refuses to operate before they investigate."

Some of the actual sounds heard were intermittent sparking, noisy cutting unit, "singing" bearing, engine knock and mower operation at excessive speed. The tape recorder also played back (in contrast) the sounds of normal operating units.

Thomas plans to capture more "sound" problems via the medium of the tape recorder. He and Jacobsen reps will then tour the country and present "sound" advice to groups of supts., park and highway commissioners and other large acreage mowing equipment men.

Evans Invites Seniors to Play in World's Championship

Senior golfer, Chick Evans, whose two great loves are golf and the Evans Scholars Foundation for caddies, has announced establishment of a World Senior Championships of golf. Senior players of 41 nations have been invited to compete.

The first annual World Senior Championships will be played Aug. 22-28, 1960, at the Broadmoor Golf Club, Colorado Springs, Colo., site of the 1959 U. S. Amateur. The Broadmoor club will donate the proceeds of the tournament to the Evans Foundation.

Match Play Championship

Like most senior tournaments, the World Senior Championships will be an invitation event open to qualified amateur golfers, 55 years or older. There will be no handicap limitations. The tournament will consist of an 18-hole qualifying round which will qualify 64 players for match play in the championship flight. Evans, twice winner of the National Amateur, once winner of the USGA Open and the only amateur to win the Western Open, has been playing senior golf since he reached 55. He'll be 70 in July and so far never has won one of the major senior events, such as the U.S.G.A. Senior, the Western Seniors, the North and South Seniors or the American Seniors Association titles.

Response May Be Poor

In addition to telegraphed invitations to prominent senior golfers in the U. S. and Canada, Evans cabled invitations to senior golfers he knows throughout the world and to the golf assns. of every country where he could learn that they existed.

He has conceded the response from other countries may be poor this year because of the comparatively short time between the issuing of invitations and the playing of the tournament. Evans, however, said that already much interest is being shown in the 1960 event.



Battery Maintenance

(Continued from page 48)

• All connections and terminals in any electrical circuit should be kept clean and tight. Loose or corroded connections have the same effect on the flow of the electrical current through batteries and circuit that a stopage in a waterpipe or a kink in a hose has on the flow of water. Loose connections and corroded battery terminals or cables that have been eaten away by acid build up resistance to the flow of electrical current and wastes it. Vehicle performance suffers accordingly.

• Golf car circuits are series circuits. One bad cell in the series will dissipate the capacity of the good cells and cause the vehicle to fail to "go the distance" or become inoperative. When this condition prevails, the battery with the bad cell should be replaced with a battery of similar age. If all of the batteries are "resonably old," the entire set should be replaced and the batteries removed, but having some usable life left should be used to replace batteries one at a time in other cars in the fleet as other batteries in the fleet become worn out . . . cell by cell.

Don't Add Acid

· Never add acid to batteries. Fooling

with specific gravity by adding acid is a job for a battery expert only.

• Follow the manufacturer's instructions for charging the batteries. Do not try to "improve" upon them.

• When taking specific gravity readings be sure to correct or adjust the readings in relationship to the temp. of the electrolyte.

 Heat is one of the greatest enemies of batteries and tends to shorten their life.

 Check water level at least once each week. Use distilled water.
