more so I have to mow more." If the amateur's mower were easily sharpened and adjusted on a do-it-yourself basis, most of the resistance to fertilizing and growing healthy grass would melt away. Nearly everyone enjoys operating a machine that works easily and does a perfect job. Trouble is most mowers don'tl

There does not appear to be any simple, easy solution to this national problem. We certainly do not have the answer. Sure, our mowers get dull, too. Then we stop, sharpen and adjust. Combined efforts of manufacturers, experimental stations, extension services, and supts. seem to offer the most likely approach to continued education of the mower-pushing public.

Rye in Bermuda

Q.—My problem is the perennial ryegrass that comes up in the fall and stools out after the Bermuda goes dormant. With those bunches all over our greens it is impossible to putt on them unless we keep the rye mowed close to the ground. How can I get rid of the perennial rye without injuring the Bermuda? Could I use something after the Bermuda goes dormant? Could I use ammonium nitrate?

I understand that rye is toxic to Bermuda and my experience is that it holds it back late in the spring. How much more water would it take for bentgrass than for Bermuda? What kind of bent would you recommend for this locality? Would Penncross creeping bent do all right here? Could bent and Bermuda be grown together? What kind of grass do you recommend for winter on Bermuda greens? (Arkansas)

A. As I analyze your problem without being able to see the greens and with the information you have given me, I suggest staying with the Bermuda greens and try to get rid of the ryegrass by close, frequent mowing and by even heavier fertilization than you have practiced. I would not use ammonium nitrate on dormant Bermuda. It would undoubtedly injure it severely. I would prefer to go to a Urea-form fertilizer which would be less toxic to dormant Bermuda.

For overseeding I suggest that you try Pennlawn creeping red fescue. This grass starts easily and quickly, can be mowed very closely — ¾ in. — and will not be nearly so competitive to the Bermuda as rye.

If you were to convert to bent, Penncross is what I recommend. However, it will take a great deal more water, management, fungicide treatments and many other things to grow bent.

Some clubs overseed Bermuda greens with bentgrass, but it has not been entirely successful. If you decide to use Pennlawn creeping red fescue, I would suggest that you sow it at the rate of 3 to 4 lbs. per 1,000 square feet. Mix it with approximately 10 lbs. of a non-burning, slow-release fertilizer which will help to distribute the seed more uniformly and will give the fescue encouragement during the winter.





One of Ten Entrants Qualify for Amateur Championship

A total of 1,757 golfers, 61 more than in 1959, filed entries for the USGA Amateur Championship which is to be played Sept. 12-17 at St. Louis CC, Clayton, Mo. Approximately one of 10 entrants will be-come eligible for the Championship through sectional qualifying competition while 19 players are automatically seeded into the Championship rounds at Clayton. These include Jack Nicklaus, the defending titleholder, Richard D. Chapman, Charlie Coe, Chick Evans and Harvie Ward, former champions. Seven foreign amateur champions who will be here for the World Amateur team championship, to be played at Merion in Ardmore, Pa., Sept. 28-Oct. 1, have been invited by the USCA to play in the 60th Amateur without qualifying.

Qualifying rounds were played at 36 sites in the U.S. on Aug. 29-30. The Metropolitan area of New York had the largest sectional field with 133 players competing for 13 qualifying spots. The next largest field was Chicago's where 132 competed for 12 places. St. Louis was the only other section with more than 100 amateurs seeking to play in the Championship.

Los Coyotes Juniors' Memorial **Event Aids Leukemia Research**

Junior members of Los Coyotes CC, Buena Park, Calif., staged their second annual Lee Hammil Memorial tournament, Aug. 22-24, in memory of a former fellow member who died last year of leukemia. All boy and girl members of the Junior Golf Assn. of Southern Calif. were eligible to play in the event with the field being restricted to the first 150 entrants. Competition for both boys and girls was for those between 12 and 17 and under 12 years of age. Proceeds of the tournament were to be turned over to the University of Southern Calif. for leukemia

Dennie Meyer, 18-year old Los Coyotes player, won the boys' 12-17 division with 74-76-72—222, beating Jim Young of Meadowlark by four strokes. In the younger boys' competition, Bill Hargis of Glendora shot 47-45-47-139 to win by six strokes from Jack Cheney of Los Coyotes. In the older girls' division, Carla Glasgow of Candlewood was the winner with a 54-hole 258 total. Lexy Martone of Los Coyotes won the 12 and under girls' title with a 141.



soft goods section. This rack promotes specific merchandise as it keeps it concentrated in the center of the shop. Atop the rack is an attractively trimmed form which is an invitation to the fellow buying slacks to also buy a shirt.

The Shoe Unit

The shoe unit (shown on page 30) is made up of adjustable shelving. The top shelf is used to attractively display every shoe style carried. Over the top an advertising poster may be placed. All shelving is adjustable for the simple reason that you may be able to delete or add shelves, depending on the size of your inventory. Should the inventory be reduced at any time you may want to use the top part of this display for soft goods, gloves, hosiery, etc. The wood shelves may be replaced by glass shelves for soft goods. In front of the shoe rack are a shoe chair, fitting stool and mirror. These items tell your members that you are definitely in the shoe business and that the fit is foremost in your mind when selling a pair of shoes.

Photo No. 3 shows various floor units. On the left hand side of the photo is a long unit in which Garlem shows all his accessories. To the left of the unit (not visible) is his office. The back side of this unit can serve as an office, and the other side as a complete merchandising unit. On the office side, Garlem maintains a cash register, charge books, lesson book, etc. In the right half of the photo is a merchandising cart, the finest promotional display fixture now available for pro shops.


