ness, is a former pres. of CMAA . . . Tarpon Springs (Fla.) GC, on 25 year lease from city, to put \$250,000 in course and clubhouse improvements.

Marshall Farnham, for 38 years, supt. of Philadelphia CC, has retired . . . He will continue in an advisory capacity to clubs and manufacturers . . . He is succeeded at Philadelphia CC by George Aman, his top asst., who has been 26 years at the club . . . Farnham, a Cornell University grad in 1917, was for five years in plant genetic research for the Carnegie Institute . . . He was a founder and a pres. of the GCSA, pres. of the Philadelphia GCSA, member of the USGA Green Section committee and member of the Turfgrass Research Advisory committee of Pennsylvania State U.

The new Harder Hall course, designed by Dick Wilson, is a grand resort layout . . .
