Another point popping up in the use of golf by commercial sponsors is the possibility of private club status being legally relinquished by clubs that rent their property to outside commercial interests.

PGA removed remainder of its belongings from "PGA National GC", Palm Beach Gardens, Fla. on Aug. 1 even though John D. MacArthur, the builder, had tried to get an injunction preventing the move . . . The PGA and MacArthur have countersuits pending involving breach of contract.







nut-grained plastic on the base and an engraving plate. The trophy is packaged in a handsome presentation box.







Mallinckrodt Offers Cure for Bermuda Spring Dead-Spot

Mallinckrodt Chemical Works, St. Louis, which has been working for several years to develop a chemical that controls spring deadspot in Bermudagrass, says that it has found the answer in Spring-Bak. It suggests that enplication be started in the fall and made regularly thereafter. Dead-spot, described last Fetruary by Stan Frederiksen, manager of distributor products, at the GCSA convention, has baifled agronomists for many years. The fungus which causes it goes to work six months or so before the onset of the disease and that is why fall treatment is recommended. Spring-Bak controls the fungus, giving the Bermuda a chance to develop a healthy root system.






